- Able to be worked, fashioned, or manipulated.

| executable | Capable of being done with means at hand and circumstances as they are. |
| feasible | Possible to do easily or conveniently. The Dutch have demonstrated that it is perfectly feasible to live below sea level. |
| <u>possible</u> | Having as much or as little of a specified quality as can be achieved. The possible effects of global warming. |
| practicable | Able to be done or put into practice successfully. The measures will be put into effect as soon as is reasonably practicable . |

| <u>likelihood</u> | The state or fact of something's being likely; probability. <i>Situations where there is a likelihood of violence.</i> |

| likely | Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>Likely</i> candidates for the job. |
| logically | In a way that is expected or sensible under the circumstances. <i>Try to stay calm and think logically about the questions.</i> |
| perceptibly | In a noticeable manner. |
| plausible | Apparently reasonable and credible, and therefore convincing. A plausible excuse. |
| possibility | Unspecified qualities of a promising nature; potential. There was the possibility that he might be turned down. |
| <u>possible</u> | The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. The shortest possible route. |
| potential | Having or showing the capacity to develop into something in the future. <i>Measurements of induced electrical potentials.</i> |
| potentially | With the capacity to develop or happen in the future. A potentially dangerous situation. |
| practicable | Able to be used; useful. A practicable solution. |
| presumable | Capable of being inferred on slight grounds. |
| <u>probable</u> | Apparently destined. It is probable that the economic situation will deteriorate further. |
| <u>quite</u> | Actually or truly or to an extreme. We ve had quite an afternoon. |
| <u>realistically</u> | In a way that is accurate and true to life. <i>How well can each candidate realistically expect to do.</i> |
| reality | Relating to reality TV. We want to make the dream a reality . |
| technically | With regard to technical skill and the technology available. A technically brilliant boxing contest. |
| <u>usefulness</u> | The quality or fact of being useful. Faults that affect the book s usefulness . |
| viable | (of a plant, animal, or cell) capable of surviving or living successfully, especially under particular environmental conditions. <i>What if the fetus were viable</i> . |
