### Definitions of "Workable" as an adjective

- *Capable of producing the desired effect or result; practicable; feasible.*
- *Able to be worked, fashioned, or manipulated.*



## Synonyms of "Workable" as an adjective (7 Words)

<b>accomplishable</b>	Able to be achieved or completed successfully. <i>We will have to negotiate and see what is <b>accomplishable</b>.</i>
<b>achievable</b>	Able to be brought about or reached successfully. <i>He broke the climb into small <b>achievable</b> stages.</i>
<b>executable</b>	Capable of being done with means at hand and circumstances as they are.
<b>feasible</b>	Possible to do easily or conveniently. <i>The Dutch have demonstrated that it is perfectly <b>feasible</b> to live below sea level.</i>
<b>possible</b>	Having as much or as little of a specified quality as can be achieved. <i>The <b>possible</b> effects of global warming.</i>
<b>practicable</b>	Able to be done or put into practice successfully. <i>The measures will be put into effect as soon as is reasonably <b>practicable</b>.</i>

**viable** (of a seed or spore) able to germinate.  
*What if the fetus were **viable**.*

## Usage Examples of "Workable" as an adjective

- *More flour and salt can be added until they make a workable dough.*
- *A workable peace settlement.*

**able** Having considerable skill proficiency or intelligence.  
*They would never be **able** to afford such a big house.*

**actual** Existing in act or fact.  
*Filmed the **actual** beating.*

**appreciably** To a noticeable degree.  
*Profits have grown **appreciably** over the last four years.*

**as** A United States territory on the eastern part of the island of Samoa.  
*Go **as fast as** you can.*

**availability** The state of being otherwise unoccupied; freedom to do something.  
*They enquired as to my **availability** for a game the following evening.*

**bound** Of an object rebound from a surface.  
*A **bound** official.*

**commercially** In a commercial manner.  
*Kiwi fruit is now also grown **commercially**.*

**conceivably** Within the realm of possibility.  
*It may **conceivably** cause liver disease.*

**convertible** A convertible security.  
*A **convertible** sofa.*

**equivalent** The mass of a particular substance that can combine with or displace one gram of hydrogen or eight grams of oxygen, used in expressing combining powers, especially of elements.  
*One unit is **equivalent** to one glass of wine.*

**feasible** Likely; probable.  
*It is not **feasible** to put most finds from excavations on public display.*

**feasibly** In a way that possible or practical to do or achieve.  
*We take customer feedback very seriously and strive to make additional improvements that can be met **feasibly**.*

<u>likelihood</u>	The state or fact of something's being likely; probability. <i>Situations where there is a <b>likelihood</b> of violence.</i>
likely	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i><b>Likely</b> candidates for the job.</i>
logically	In a way that is expected or sensible under the circumstances. <i>Try to stay calm and think <b>logically</b> about the questions.</i>
perceptibly	In a noticeable manner.
plausible	Apparently reasonable and credible, and therefore convincing. <i>A <b>plausible</b> excuse.</i>
possibility	Unspecified qualities of a promising nature; potential. <i>There was the <b>possibility</b> that he might be turned down.</i>
<u>possible</u>	The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <i>The shortest <b>possible</b> route.</i>
potential	Having or showing the capacity to develop into something in the future. <i>Measurements of induced electrical <b>potentials</b>.</i>
potentially	With the capacity to develop or happen in the future. <i>A <b>potentially</b> dangerous situation.</i>
practicable	Able to be used; useful. <i>A <b>practicable</b> solution.</i>
presumable	Capable of being inferred on slight grounds.
<u>probable</u>	Apparently destined. <i>It is <b>probable</b> that the economic situation will deteriorate further.</i>
<u>quite</u>	Actually or truly or to an extreme. <i>We ve had <b>quite</b> an afternoon.</i>
<u>realistically</u>	In a way that is accurate and true to life. <i>How well can each candidate <b>realistically</b> expect to do.</i>
reality	Relating to reality TV. <i>We want to make the dream a <b>reality</b>.</i>
technically	With regard to technical skill and the technology available. <i>A <b>technically</b> brilliant boxing contest.</i>
<u>usefulness</u>	The quality or fact of being useful. <i>Faults that affect the book s <b>usefulness</b>.</i>
viable	(of a plant, animal, or cell) capable of surviving or living successfully, especially under particular environmental conditions. <i>What if the fetus were <b>viable</b>.</i>
