<b>assiduity</b>	Constant or close attention to what one is doing. <i>The <b>assiduity</b> with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
<b><u>assiduous</u></b>	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>She was <b>assiduous</b> in pointing out every feature.</i>
<b>conscientious</b>	Guided by or in accordance with conscience or sense of right and wrong. <i>A <b>conscientious</b> man he took his duties very seriously.</i>
<b><u>cooperatively</u></b>	(in relation to the owning or running of a business) jointly by a group of people, with profits or benefits shared among them. <i>The two publishers will work <b>cooperatively</b> on poster projects.</i>
<b><u>diligence</u></b>	Conscientiousness in paying proper attention to a task; giving the degree of care required in a given situation. <i>His <b>diligence</b> won him quick promotions.</i>
<b>diligent</b>	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>A <b>diligent</b> search of the files.</i>
<b>drudgery</b>	Hard monotonous routine work. <i>Domestic <b>drudgery</b>.</i>

<b>employed</b>	(of a person) having a paid job. <i>Most of our graduates are <b>employed</b>.</i>
<b>employment</b>	The act of giving someone a job. <i>They are looking for <b>employment</b>.</i>
<b>engaged</b>	Of facilities such as telephones or lavatories unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line. <i>Deeply <b>engaged</b> in conversation.</i>
<b>functional</b>	Designed for or adapted to a function or use. <i>A small <b>functional</b> bathroom.</i>
<b>hardworking</b>	Characterized by hard work and perseverance.
<b>hire</b>	Engage or hire for work. <i>We flew to San Diego <b>hired</b> a car and headed for Las Vegas.</i>
<b>hired</b>	Hired for the exclusive temporary use of a group of travelers. <i>A <b>hired</b> gun.</i>
<b>industrious</b>	Diligent and hard-working. <i>An <b>industrious</b> people striving to make their country prosperous.</i>
<b>interact</b>	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>All the stages in the process <b>interact</b>.</i>
<b>labor</b>	An organized attempt by workers to improve their status by united action particularly via labor unions or the leaders of this movement. <i>His <b>labor</b> did not require a great deal of skill.</i>
<b>meticulous</b>	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>He had always been so <b>meticulous</b> about his appearance.</i>
<b>occupied</b>	Held or filled or in use. <i>She keeps her time well <b>occupied</b>.</i>
<b>overtime</b>	Payment for overtime. <i>The company could not afford to pay <b>overtime</b>.</i>
<b>painstaking</b>	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i><b>Painstaking</b> research.</i>
<b>partnership</b>	An association of two or more people as partners. <i>Their 176 run third wicket <b>partnership</b>.</i>
<b>plodding</b>	(of a person) thorough and hard-working but lacking in imagination or intelligence. <i>A <b>plodding</b> comedy drama.</i>
<b>scrupulous</b>	Very concerned to avoid doing wrong. <i>She s too <b>scrupulous</b> to have an affair with a married man.</i>



<b>sedulous</b>	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>He watched himself with the most <b>sedulous</b> care.</i>
<b>semiskilled</b>	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i>A <b>semiskilled</b> job.</i>
<b><u>studious</u></b>	Showing great care or attention. <i>Made a <b>studious</b> attempt to fix the television set.</i>
<b>successfully</b>	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>She has <b>successfully</b> completed her mission.</i>
<b>work</b>	Give a workout to. <i>This artist <b>works</b> mostly in acrylics.</i>
<b>worker</b>	A neuter or undeveloped female bee, wasp, ant, or other social insect, large numbers of which do the basic work of the colony. <i>He is a good <b>worker</b>.</i>
