Appropriate for or engaged in office work.
***Clerical** skills.*

<u>consumerism</u>	A movement advocating greater protection of the interests of consumers. <i>Many people are becoming increasingly conscious of the environmental impact of consumerism.</i>
exaggerated	Enlarged or altered beyond normal proportions. <i>Thick lenses exaggerated the size of her eyes.</i>
excessive	Unrestrained, especially with regard to feelings. <i>Excessive charges.</i>
excessively	To a degree exceeding normal or proper limits. <i>Excessively high taxes.</i>
extra	Excessive or extravagant. <i>I had an education with all the extras.</i>
headquarters	A military unit consisting of a commander and the headquarters staff. <i>Many companies have their headquarters in New York.</i>
<u>hectic</u>	A hectic fever or flush. <i>A hectic business schedule.</i>
immoderate	Not sensible or restrained; excessive. <i>Immoderate spending.</i>
<u>inordinate</u>	(of a person) unrestrained in feelings or behaviour. <i>A book of inordinate length.</i>
intemperate	Excessive in behavior. <i>Intemperate rage.</i>
job	A workplace as in the expression on the job. <i>We thought you'd have a job getting there.</i>
levity	A manner lacking seriousness. <i>As an attempt to introduce a note of levity the words were a disastrous flop.</i>
management	The treatment or control of diseases or disorders, or the care of patients who suffer them. <i>Businesses were slow to adopt the key elements of environmental risk management.</i>
materialism	The philosophical theory that matter is the only reality. <i>They hated the sinful materialism of the wicked city.</i>
<u>occupation</u>	The action, state, or period of occupying or being occupied by military force. <i>People in professional occupations.</i>
office	Professional or clerical workers in an office. <i>The offices of the mass.</i>

<u>overly</u>	Excessively. <i>She was a jealous and overly possessive woman.</i>
pedantry	Excessive concern with minor details and rules. <i>To object to this is not mere pedantry.</i>
<u>quantity</u>	The figure or symbol representing a quantity. <i>He had a quantity of ammunition.</i>
sinecure	A position requiring little or no work but giving the holder status or financial benefit. <i>Political sinecures for the supporters of ministers.</i>
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
superfluous	Serving no useful purpose; having no excuse for being. <i>Delete superfluous or unnecessary words.</i>
<u>too</u>	Moreover (used when adding a further point). <i>He wore suits that seemed a size too small for him.</i>
<u>undue</u>	Lacking justification or authorization. <i>His dress stops just short of undue elegance.</i>
<u>unjustified</u>	Lacking justification or authorization. <i>Unjustified price increases.</i>
<u>unwarranted</u>	Incapable of being justified or explained. <i>Unwarranted limitations of personal freedom.</i>
usurious	Relating to or characterized by usury; extortionate. <i>They lend money at usurious rates.</i>
<u>workplace</u>	A place where people work, such as an office or factory. <i>Workplace nurseries.</i>
