exaggerated	<p>Enlarged or altered beyond normal proportions.</p> <p><i>Thick lenses exaggerated the size of her eyes.</i></p>
excessive	<p>Unrestrained, especially with regard to feelings.</p> <p><i>Excessive charges.</i></p>
excessively	<p>To a degree exceeding normal or proper limits.</p> <p><i>Excessively high taxes.</i></p>
extra	<p>Excessive or extravagant.</p> <p><i>I had an education with all the extras.</i></p>
headquarters	<p>A military unit consisting of a commander and the headquarters staff.</p> <p><i>Many companies have their headquarters in New York.</i></p>
<u>hectic</u>	<p>A hectic fever or flush.</p> <p><i>A hectic business schedule.</i></p>
immoderate	<p>Not sensible or restrained; excessive.</p> <p><i>Immoderate spending.</i></p>
<u>inordinate</u>	<p>(of a person) unrestrained in feelings or behaviour.</p> <p><i>A book of inordinate length.</i></p>
intemperate	<p>Excessive in behavior.</p> <p><i>Intemperate rage.</i></p>
job	<p>A workplace as in the expression on the job.</p> <p><i>We thought you d have a job getting there.</i></p>
levity	<p>A manner lacking seriousness.</p> <p><i>As an attempt to introduce a note of levity the words were a disastrous flop.</i></p>
management	<p>The treatment or control of diseases or disorders, or the care of patients who suffer them.</p> <p><i>Businesses were slow to adopt the key elements of environmental risk management.</i></p>
materialism	<p>The philosophical theory that matter is the only reality.</p> <p><i>They hated the sinful materialism of the wicked city.</i></p>
<u>occupation</u>	<p>The action, state, or period of occupying or being occupied by military force.</p> <p><i>People in professional occupations.</i></p>
office	<p>Professional or clerical workers in an office.</p> <p><i>The offices of the mass.</i></p>

<u>overly</u>	Excessively. <i>She was a jealous and overly possessive woman.</i>
pedantry	Excessive concern with minor details and rules. <i>To object to this is not mere pedantry.</i>
<u>quantity</u>	The figure or symbol representing a quantity. <i>He had a quantity of ammunition.</i>
sinecure	A position requiring little or no work but giving the holder status or financial benefit. <i>Political sinecures for the supporters of ministers.</i>
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
superfluous	Serving no useful purpose; having no excuse for being. <i>Delete superfluous or unnecessary words.</i>
<u>too</u>	Moreover (used when adding a further point). <i>He wore suits that seemed a size too small for him.</i>
<u>undue</u>	Lacking justification or authorization. <i>His dress stops just short of undue elegance.</i>
<u>unjustified</u>	Lacking justification or authorization. <i>Unjustified price increases.</i>
<u>unwarranted</u>	Incapable of being justified or explained. <i>Unwarranted limitations of personal freedom.</i>
usurious	Relating to or characterized by usury; extortionate. <i>They lend money at usurious rates.</i>
<u>workplace</u>	A place where people work, such as an office or factory. <i>Workplace nurseries.</i>
