<u>studio</u>	A studio flat. All apartments and <b>studio</b> s have private facilities.
work	A place where work is done. He was indebted to the pioneering <b>work</b> of John Dewey.
workroom	A room for working in, especially one equipped for a particular kind of work.

<u>backdrop</u>	Scenery hung at back of stage. The conference took place against a <b>backdrop</b> of increasing diplomatic activity.
bureau	A writing desk with drawers and typically an angled top opening downwards to form a writing surface. <i>The London <b>bureau</b> of the Washington Post.</i>
circumstance	The set of facts or circumstances that surround a situation or event. The artists are living in reduced <b>circumstance</b> s.
circumstances	Your overall circumstances or condition in life including everything that happens to you. <i>A victim of circumstances.</i>
clerical	Concerned with or relating to work in an office, especially routine documentation and administrative tasks. <i>A clerical job</i> .



configure	Set up for a particular purpose. <b>Configure</b> my new computer.
environ	Surround; enclose. The stone circle was <b>environ</b> ed by an expanse of peat soil.
environment	The setting or conditions in which a particular activity is carried on. <i>He longed for the comfortable environment of his living room.</i>
headhunter	A person who identifies and approaches suitable candidates employed elsewhere to fill business positions. A <b>headhunter</b> offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.
headquarters	Plural a military unit consisting of a commander and the headquarters staff. Its national <b>headquarters</b> are in Florida.
healthiness	The state of being vigorous and free from bodily or mental disease.
macroeconomics	The branch of economics concerned with large-scale or general economic factors, such as interest rates and national productivity.
occupation	The period of time during which a place or position or nation is occupied. During the German <b>occupation</b> of Paris.
office	Of a government or government official holding an office means being in power. <i>The office</i> s of a nurse.
panorama	A picture or photograph containing a wide view. The galleries will offer a full <b>panorama</b> of 20th century art.
<u>profession</u>	A body of people engaged in a particular profession. The legal <b>profession</b> has become increasingly business conscious.
readjust	Adjust again after an initial failure. It can take years to <b>readjust</b> to this situation.
reconfirm	Confirm again. You must <b>reconfirm</b> your flight reservations.
<u>scene</u>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. A <b>scene</b> of carnage.
setting	A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. A garnet in a heavy gold <b>setting</b> .
sinecure	A position requiring little or no work but giving the holder status or financial benefit. <i>Political sinecures for the supporters of ministers.</i>



situation	A set of circumstances in which one finds oneself; a state of affairs. The present international <b>situation</b> is dangerous.
surroundings	The area in which something exists or lives. I took up the time admiring my <b>surroundings</b> .
tactical	Relating to or constituting actions carefully planned to gain a specific military end. NATO already has about 7 000 <b>tactical</b> nuclear weapons in Europe.
tectonic	Pertaining to the structure or movement of the earth's crust. <i>Tectonic</i> plates.
terms	Status with respect to the relations between people or groups. <i>On good <b>terms</b> with her in laws.</i>
thermostat	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
unperturbed	Not perturbed or concerned. Kenneth seems <b>unperturbed</b> by the news.
unsanitary	Not sanitary. The <b>unsanitary</b> conditions in the orphanage.
vocation	The particular occupation for which you are trained. Not all of us have a <b>vocation</b> to be nurses or doctors.
