Synonyms of "Workplace" as a noun (6 Words)

library

A collection of books and periodicals held in a library.
*There was a **library** that Uncle Hilbert used as his study.*

office

Professional or clerical workers in an office.
*The whole **office** was late the morning of the blizzard.*

place of work The particular portion of space occupied by something.

studio

A studio flat.
*All apartments and **studios** have private facilities.*

work

A place where work is done.
*He was indebted to the pioneering **work** of John Dewey.*

workroom

A room for working in, especially one equipped for a particular kind of work.



Usage Examples of "Workplace" as a noun

- *Health and safety in the workplace.*



Associations of "Workplace" (30 Words)

- backdrop** Scenery hung at back of stage.
*The conference took place against a **backdrop** of increasing diplomatic activity.*
- bureau** A writing desk with drawers and typically an angled top opening downwards to form a writing surface.
*The London **bureau** of the Washington Post.*
- circumstance** The set of facts or circumstances that surround a situation or event.
*The artists are living in reduced **circumstances**.*
- circumstances** Your overall circumstances or condition in life including everything that happens to you.
*A victim of **circumstances**.*
- clerical** Concerned with or relating to work in an office, especially routine documentation and administrative tasks.
*A **clerical** job.*

configure	Set up for a particular purpose. <i>Configure my new computer.</i>
environ	Surround; enclose. <i>The stone circle was enviored by an expanse of peat soil.</i>
environment	The setting or conditions in which a particular activity is carried on. <i>He longed for the comfortable environment of his living room.</i>
headhunter	A person who identifies and approaches suitable candidates employed elsewhere to fill business positions. <i>A headhunter offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.</i>
headquarters	Plural a military unit consisting of a commander and the headquarters staff. <i>Its national headquarters are in Florida.</i>
healthiness	The state of being vigorous and free from bodily or mental disease.
macroeconomics	The branch of economics concerned with large-scale or general economic factors, such as interest rates and national productivity.
<u>occupation</u>	The period of time during which a place or position or nation is occupied. <i>During the German occupation of Paris.</i>
office	Of a government or government official holding an office means being in power. <i>The offices of a nurse.</i>
panorama	A picture or photograph containing a wide view. <i>The galleries will offer a full panorama of 20th century art.</i>
<u>profession</u>	A body of people engaged in a particular profession. <i>The legal profession has become increasingly business conscious.</i>
readjust	Adjust again after an initial failure. <i>It can take years to readjust to this situation.</i>
reconfirm	Confirm again. <i>You must reconfirm your flight reservations.</i>
<u>scene</u>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>A scene of carnage.</i>
setting	A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. <i>A garnet in a heavy gold setting.</i>
sinecure	A position requiring little or no work but giving the holder status or financial benefit. <i>Political sinecures for the supporters of ministers.</i>

situation	A set of circumstances in which one finds oneself; a state of affairs. <i>The present international situation is dangerous.</i>
surroundings	The area in which something exists or lives. <i>I took up the time admiring my surroundings.</i>
tactical	Relating to or constituting actions carefully planned to gain a specific military end. <i>NATO already has about 7 000 tactical nuclear weapons in Europe.</i>
tectonic	Pertaining to the structure or movement of the earth's crust. <i>Tectonic plates.</i>
terms	Status with respect to the relations between people or groups. <i>On good terms with her in laws.</i>
thermostat	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
unperturbed	Not perturbed or concerned. <i>Kenneth seems unperturbed by the news.</i>
unsanitary	Not sanitary. <i>The unsanitary conditions in the orphanage.</i>
vocation	The particular occupation for which you are trained. <i>Not all of us have a vocation to be nurses or doctors.</i>
