### library

### **office**

Professional or clerical workers in an office.  
*The whole **office** was late the morning of the blizzard.*

**place of work** The particular portion of space occupied by something.

### studio

A studio flat.  
*All apartments and **studios** have private facilities.*

### **work**

A place where work is done.  
*He was indebted to the pioneering **work** of John Dewey.*

### **workroom**

A room for working in, especially one equipped for a particular kind of work.

## Associations of "Workplace" (30 Words)

### backdrop

Scenery hung at back of stage.

*The conference took place against a **backdrop** of increasing diplomatic activity.*

### **bureau**

A writing desk with drawers and typically an angled top opening downwards to form a writing surface.

*The London **bureau** of the Washington Post.*

### **circumstance**

The set of facts or circumstances that surround a situation or event.

*The artists are living in reduced **circumstances**.*

### **circumstances**

Your overall circumstances or condition in life including everything that happens to you.

*A victim of **circumstances**.*

### **clerical**

Concerned with or relating to work in an office, especially routine documentation and administrative tasks.

*A **clerical** job.*

<b>configure</b>	Set up for a particular purpose. <i><b>Configure</b> my new computer.</i>
<b>environ</b>	Surround; enclose. <i>The stone circle was <b>envi</b>roned by an expanse of peat soil.</i>
<b>environment</b>	The setting or conditions in which a particular activity is carried on. <i>He longed for the comfortable <b>envi</b>ronment of his living room.</i>
<b>headhunter</b>	A person who identifies and approaches suitable candidates employed elsewhere to fill business positions. <i>A <b>head</b>hunter offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.</i>
<b>headquarters</b>	Plural a military unit consisting of a commander and the headquarters staff. <i>Its national <b>head</b>quarters are in Florida.</i>
<b>healthiness</b>	The state of being vigorous and free from bodily or mental disease.
<b>macroeconomics</b>	The branch of economics concerned with large-scale or general economic factors, such as interest rates and national productivity.
<u><b>occupation</b></u>	The period of time during which a place or position or nation is occupied. <i>During the German <b>occu</b>pation of Paris.</i>
<b>office</b>	Of a government or government official holding an office means being in power. <i>The <b>offi</b>ces of a nurse.</i>
<b>panorama</b>	A picture or photograph containing a wide view. <i>The galleries will offer a full <b>pano</b>rama of 20th century art.</i>
<u><b>profession</b></u>	A body of people engaged in a particular profession. <i>The legal <b>prof</b>ession has become increasingly business conscious.</i>
<b>readjust</b>	Adjust again after an initial failure. <i>It can take years to <b>read</b>just to this situation.</i>
<b>reconfirm</b>	Confirm again. <i>You must <b>recon</b>firm your flight reservations.</i>
<u><b>scene</b></u>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>A <b>scen</b>e of carnage.</i>
<b>setting</b>	A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. <i>A garnet in a heavy gold <b>set</b>ting.</i>
<b>sinecure</b>	A position requiring little or no work but giving the holder status or financial benefit. <i>Political <b>sine</b>cures for the supporters of ministers.</i>

<b>situation</b>	A set of circumstances in which one finds oneself; a state of affairs. <i>The present international <b>situation</b> is dangerous.</i>
<b>surroundings</b>	The area in which something exists or lives. <i>I took up the time admiring my <b>surroundings</b>.</i>
<b>tactical</b>	Relating to or constituting actions carefully planned to gain a specific military end. <i>NATO already has about 7 000 <b>tactical</b> nuclear weapons in Europe.</i>
<b>tectonic</b>	Pertaining to the structure or movement of the earth's crust. <i><b>Tectonic</b> plates.</i>
<b>terms</b>	Status with respect to the relations between people or groups. <i>On good <b>terms</b> with her in laws.</i>
<b>thermostat</b>	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
<b>unperturbed</b>	Not perturbed or concerned. <i>Kenneth seems <b>unperturbed</b> by the news.</i>
<b>unsanitary</b>	Not sanitary. <i>The <b>unsanitary</b> conditions in the orphanage.</i>
<b>vocation</b>	The particular occupation for which you are trained. <i>Not all of us have a <b>vocation</b> to be nurses or doctors.</i>
