<b><u>cosmopolitan</u></b>	Growing or occurring in many parts of the world. <i>An issue of <b>cosmopolitan</b> import.</i>
<b>ecumenical</b>	Of worldwide scope or applicability. <i>The <b>ecumenical</b> movement.</i>
<b><u>general</u></b>	Prevailing among and common to the general public. <i><b>General</b> studies.</i>
<b><u>global</u></b>	Having the shape of a sphere or ball. <i><b>Global</b> searches.</i>

<b>planetary</b>	Relating to the earth as a planet. <i>The <b>planetary</b> tilt.</i>
<b><u>universal</u></b>	Relating to or done by all people or things in the world or in a particular group; applicable to all cases. <i><b>Universal</b> wrench.</i>
<b>world</b>	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <i>Of <b>worldwide</b> significance.</i>
<b>world-wide</b>	Of worldwide scope or applicability- Christopher Morley.

The branch of astrophysics that studies the origin and evolution and structure of the universe.

### cosmography

A representation of the earth or the heavens.

*The **cosmography** of Ptolemy.*

### cosmopolitan

A cosmopolitan person.

*That queer **cosmopolitan** rather sinister crowd found around the Marseilles docks.*

<u>cosmos</u>	The universe seen as a well-ordered whole. <i>He sat staring deep into the void reminding himself of man s place in the <b>cosmos</b>.</i>
countrywide	Extending throughout a nation. <i>A <b>countrywide</b> tour.</i>
generic	Any product that can be sold without a brand name. <i>Is there a <b>generic</b> Asian mind.</i>
<u>global</u>	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <i>Give students a <b>global</b> picture of what is involved in the task.</i>
<u>globalization</u>	Growth to a global or worldwide scale. <i>The <b>globalization</b> of the communication industry.</i>
globalize	Make world-wide in scope or application. <i>Building facilities overseas is part of the strategy of every company that aims to <b>globalize</b>.</i>
globe	Form something into a globe. <i>A female figure holding a sceptre and <b>globe</b>.</i>
greenpeace	An international organization that works for environmental conservation and the preservation of endangered species.
<u>immigration</u>	Migration into a place (especially migration to a country of which you are not a native in order to settle there). <i>A barrier to control illegal <b>immigration</b> from Mexico.</i>
intercontinental	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i><b>Intercontinental</b> flights.</i>
<u>international</u>	Any of several international socialist organizations. <i>The Murrayfield rugby <b>international</b>.</i>
internationally	Throughout the world. <i>Companies looking to trade <b>internationally</b>.</i>
locally	To a restricted area of the body. <i>The service control function is installed <b>locally</b>.</i>
macrocosm	The whole of a complex structure, especially the world or the universe, contrasted with a small or representative part of it.
multinational	A company operating in several countries. <i>The oil industry was entirely controlled by five <b>multinationals</b>.</i>
nationally	In a way that relates to a whole nation. <i>A <b>nationally</b> recognized brand.</i>
planetary	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <i>A <b>planetary</b> system.</i>

<b>spaceman</b>	An astronaut.
<b>spaceship</b>	A spacecraft, especially one controlled by a crew.
<b>transcontinental</b>	A transcontinental railway or train. <i><b>Transcontinental</b> travelers.</i>
<b>transnational</b>	Extending or operating across national boundaries. <i><b>Transnational</b> advertising agencies.</i>
<u><b>traveled</b></u>	Traveled over or through sometimes used as a combining term. <i>Well <b>traveled</b> people.</i>
<u><b>universal</b></u>	A thing having universal effect currency or application. <i>The incidents caused <b>universal</b> concern.</i>
<u><b>universe</b></u>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>The front parlour was the hub of her <b>universe</b>.</i>
<b>world</b>	All of the people and societies on the earth. <i>A <b>world</b> crisis.</i>
