<u>cosmopolitan</u>	Growing or occurring in many parts of the world. <i>An issue of cosmopolitan import.</i>
ecumenical	Of worldwide scope or applicability. <i>The ecumenical movement.</i>
<u>general</u>	Prevailing among and common to the general public. <i>General studies.</i>
<u>global</u>	Having the shape of a sphere or ball. <i>Global searches.</i>
intercontinental	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i>Intercontinental ballistic missiles.</i>
<u>international</u>	Concerning or belonging to all or at least two or more nations. <i>An international agreement.</i>
oecumenical	Concerned with promoting unity among churches or religions.

pandemic	Existing everywhere. <i>Pandemic diseases have occurred throughout history.</i>
planetary	Relating to the earth as a planet. <i>The planetary tilt.</i>
<u>universal</u>	Relating to or done by all people or things in the world or in a particular group; applicable to all cases. <i>Universal wrench.</i>
world	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <i>Of worldwide significance.</i>
world-wide	Of worldwide scope or applicability- Christopher Morley.

astronaut

A person who is trained to travel in a spacecraft.

astronomer

An expert in or student of astronomy.

cosmogony

The branch of astrophysics that studies the origin and evolution and structure of the universe.

*Today the central questions of cosmology and **cosmogony** are being explored within the framework of the Big Bang theory.*

cosmography

A representation of the earth or the heavens.

*The **cosmography** of Ptolemy.*

cosmopolitan

A cosmopolitan person.

*That queer **cosmopolitan** rather sinister crowd found around the Marseilles docks.*

<u>cosmos</u>	The universe seen as a well-ordered whole. <i>He sat staring deep into the void reminding himself of man s place in the cosmos.</i>
countrywide	Extending throughout a nation. <i>A countrywide tour.</i>
generic	Any product that can be sold without a brand name. <i>Is there a generic Asian mind.</i>
<u>global</u>	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <i>Give students a global picture of what is involved in the task.</i>
<u>globalization</u>	Growth to a global or worldwide scale. <i>The globalization of the communication industry.</i>
globalize	Make world-wide in scope or application. <i>Building facilities overseas is part of the strategy of every company that aims to globalize.</i>
globe	Form something into a globe. <i>A female figure holding a sceptre and globe.</i>
greenpeace	An international organization that works for environmental conservation and the preservation of endangered species.
<u>immigration</u>	Migration into a place (especially migration to a country of which you are not a native in order to settle there). <i>A barrier to control illegal immigration from Mexico.</i>
intercontinental	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i>Intercontinental flights.</i>
<u>international</u>	Any of several international socialist organizations. <i>The Murrayfield rugby international.</i>
internationally	Throughout the world. <i>Companies looking to trade internationally.</i>
locally	To a restricted area of the body. <i>The service control function is installed locally.</i>
macrocosm	The whole of a complex structure, especially the world or the universe, contrasted with a small or representative part of it.
multinational	A company operating in several countries. <i>The oil industry was entirely controlled by five multinationals.</i>
nationally	In a way that relates to a whole nation. <i>A nationally recognized brand.</i>
planetary	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <i>A planetary system.</i>

spaceman	An astronaut.
spaceship	A spacecraft, especially one controlled by a crew.
transcontinental	A transcontinental railway or train. <i>Transcontinental travelers.</i>
transnational	Extending or operating across national boundaries. <i>Transnational advertising agencies.</i>
<u>traveled</u>	Traveled over or through sometimes used as a combining term. <i>Well traveled people.</i>
<u>universal</u>	A thing having universal effect currency or application. <i>The incidents caused universal concern.</i>
<u>universe</u>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>The front parlour was the hub of her universe.</i>
world	All of the people and societies on the earth. <i>A world crisis.</i>
