- *His worry over the prospect of being fired.*

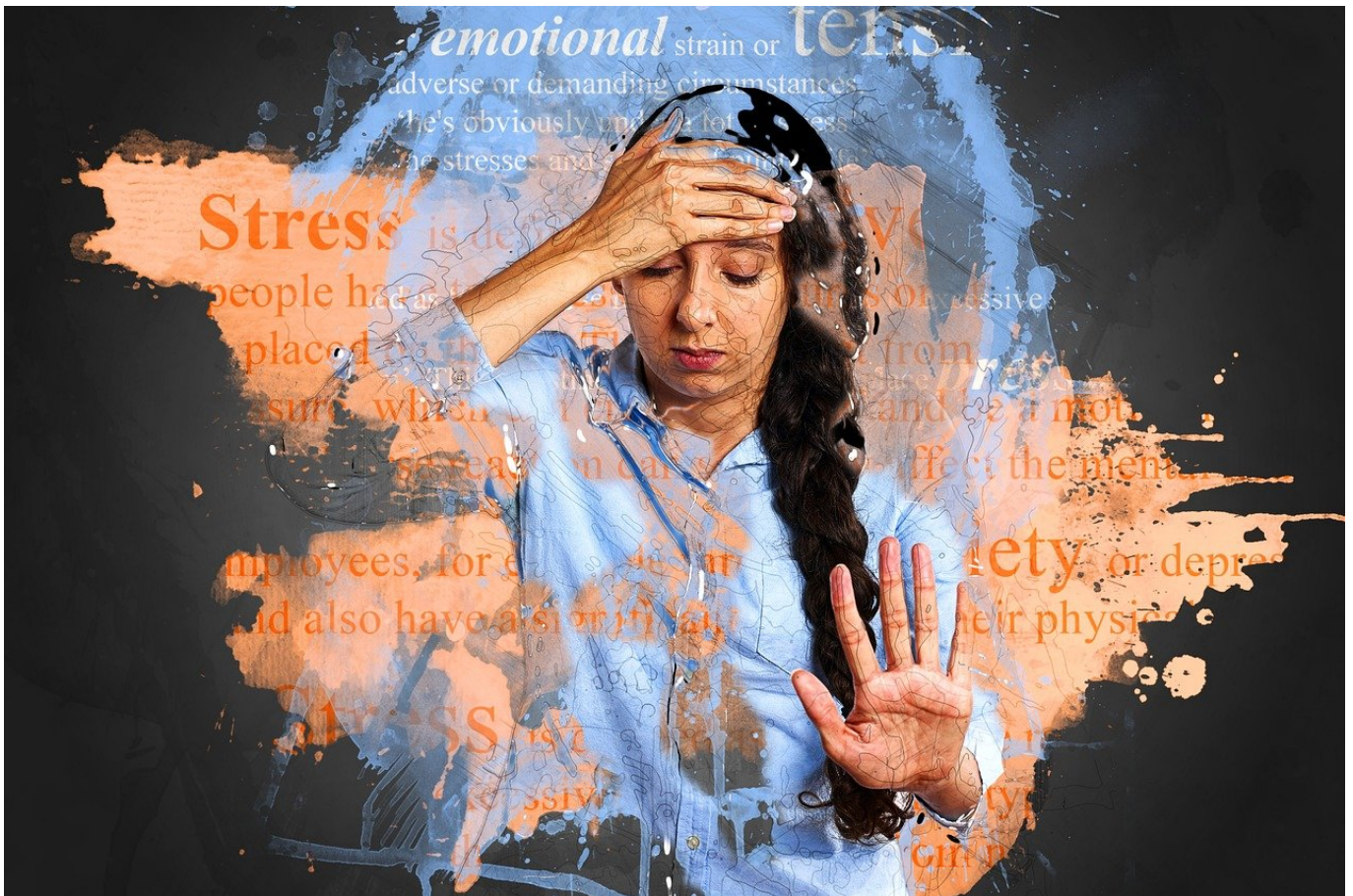


## Worries as a Verb

### Definitions of "Worries" as a verb

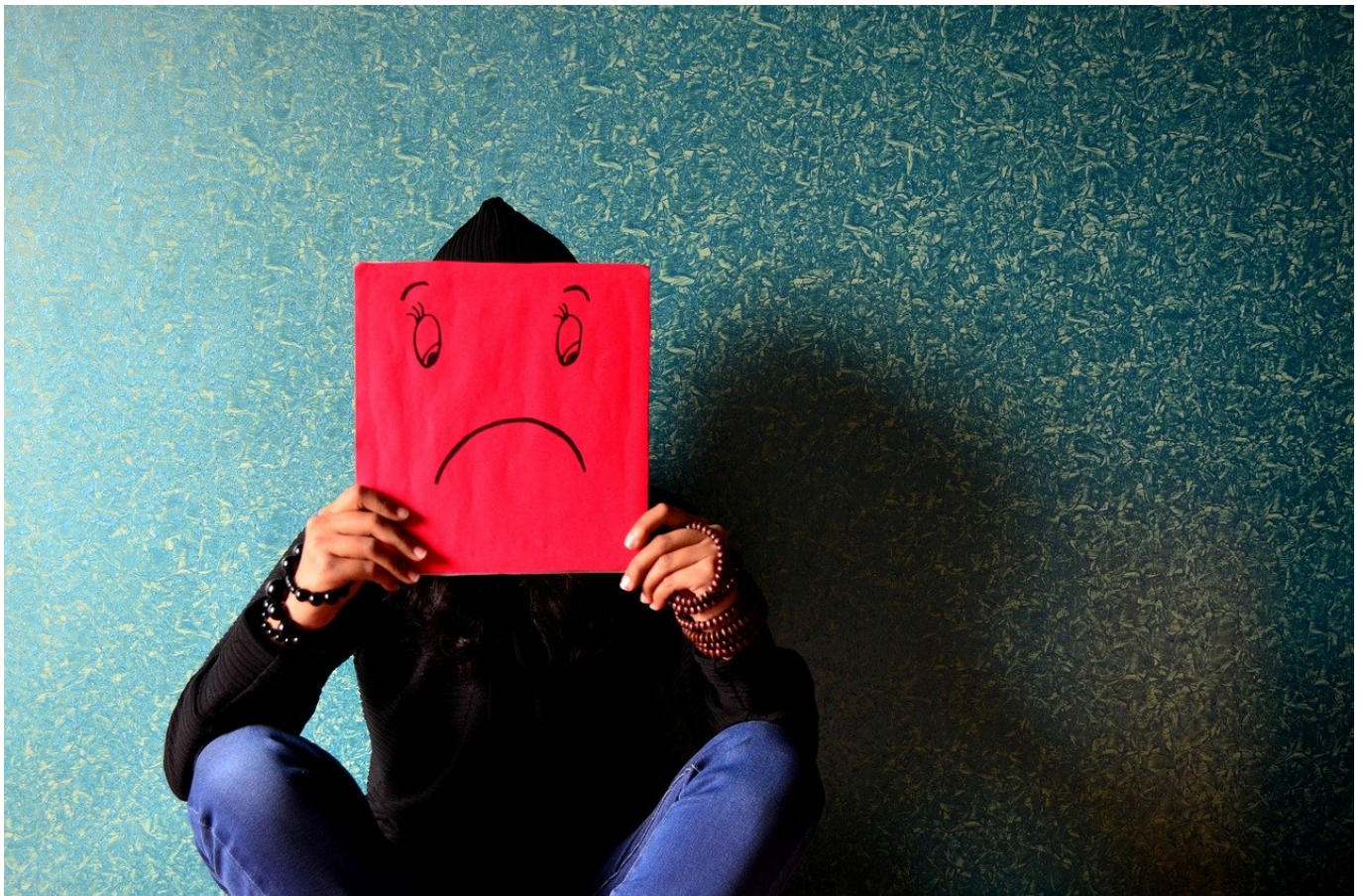
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "worries" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Touch or rub constantly.*
- *Lacerate by biting.*
- *Disturb the peace of mind of; afflict with mental agitation or distress.*
- *Be worried, concerned, anxious, troubled, or uneasy.*
- *Be on the mind of.*
- *Be concerned with.*



## Synonyms of "Worries" as a verb (5 Words)

- care** Provide care for.  
*I really **care** about my work.*
- concern** Be on the mind of.  
*The roof of the barn **concerns** me because eventually it will fall in.*
- interest** Excite the curiosity of engage the interest of.  
*Efforts were made to **interest** her in a purchase.*
- occupy** Fill or preoccupy the mind.  
*The young prince will soon **occupy** the throne.*
- vex** Be a mystery or bewildering to.  
*Thou shalt not **vex** a stranger.*

- *I worry about the second Germanic consonant shift.*

- *I worry about my job.*
- *I worry about my grades.*

<b>afraid</b>	Filled with fear or apprehension. <i><b>Afraid</b> to show emotion.</i>
<b>annoy</b>	Cause annoyance in disturb especially by minor irritations. <i>Your damned cheerfulness has always <b>annoyed</b> me.</i>
<b>annoyance</b>	A thing that annoys someone; a nuisance. <i>The Council found him an <b>annoyance</b>.</i>
<b>annoyed</b>	Slightly angry; irritated. <i>He was <b>annoyed</b> at being woken up so early.</i>
<b>anxious</b>	Very eager or concerned to do something or for something to happen. <i>She was extremely <b>anxious</b> about her exams.</i>
<b>anxiously</b>	In a manner resulting from or revealing anxiety. <i>We are all waiting <b>anxiously</b> for any news.</i>
<b>apprehensive</b>	Relating to perception or understanding. <i>Felt <b>apprehensive</b> about the consequences.</i>
<b>bother</b>	Cause annoyance in; disturb, especially by minor irritations. <i>A spot of <b>bother</b>.</i>
<b>chagrin</b>	Feel distressed or humiliated. <i>To my <b>chagrin</b> he was nowhere to be seen.</i>
<b>concern</b>	Something or someone that causes anxiety; a source of unhappiness. <i>Don't <b>concern</b> yourself old boy my lips are sealed.</i>
<b>distracted</b>	Unable to concentrate because one is preoccupied by something worrying or unpleasant. <i>Charlotte seemed too <b>distracted</b> to give him much attention.</i>
<b>distress</b>	Bring into difficulties or distress especially financial hardship. <i>Vessels in <b>distress</b> on or near the coast.</i>
<b>disturb</b>	Interfere with the normal arrangement or functioning of. <i>Take the rollers out carefully so as not to <b>disturb</b> the curls too much.</i>
<b>disturbing</b>	Causing anxiety; worrying. <i>A <b>disturbing</b> amount of crime.</i>
<b>headache</b>	A thing or person that causes worry or difficulty; a problem. <i>An administrative <b>headache</b>.</i>
<b>inconvenience</b>	To cause inconvenience or discomfort to. <i>The <b>inconvenience</b> of having to change trains.</i>
<b>incubus</b>	A nightmare. <i>Debt is a big <b>incubus</b> in developing countries.</i>

<b><u>irritation</u></b>	A sudden outburst of anger. <i>Any food produced <b>irritation</b> of the stomach.</i>
<b>nuisance</b>	An act which is harmful or offensive to the public or a member of it and for which there is a legal remedy. <i>I hope you re not going to make a <b>nuisance</b> of yourself.</i>
<b>offend</b>	Hurt the feelings of. <i>17 per cent of viewers said they had been <b>offended</b> by bad language.</i>
<b>solicitude</b>	A feeling of excessive concern. <i>I was touched by his <b>solicitude</b>.</i>
<b><u>terrifying</u></b>	Causing extreme terror. <i>The <b>terrifying</b> events of the past few weeks.</i>
<b>trouble</b>	Take the trouble to do something concern oneself. <i>He did not <b>trouble</b> to call his mother on her birthday.</i>
<b><u>uncomfortable</u></b>	Providing or experiencing physical discomfort. <i>This kind of life can prove disruptive and <b>uncomfortable</b>.</i>
<b><u>uneasy</u></b>	Lacking a sense of security or affording no ease or reassurance. <i><b>Uneasy</b> lies the head that wears the crown.</i>
<b>upset</b>	The act of upsetting something. <i>Everyone gets stomach <b>upsets</b> from time to time.</i>
<b>vex</b>	Subject to prolonged examination, discussion, or deliberation. <i>I wouldn t <b>vex</b> it will be just great if whoever borrow the pump just bring it back.</i>
<b><u>vexation</u></b>	The act of troubling or annoying someone. <i>The <b>vexations</b> of life under canvas.</i>
<b>worried</b>	Mentally upset over possible misfortune or danger etc. <i>Michelle knew that her friends were very <b>worried</b> about her.</i>
<b>worrying</b>	The act of moving something by repeated tugs or pushes. <i>A <b>worrying</b> situation.</i>
