- Be worried, concerned, anxious, troubled, or uneasy.
- Be on the mind of.
- Be concerned with.

Thou shalt not **vex** a stranger.




Usage Examples of "Worries" as a verb

Associations of "Worries" (30 Words)

afraid Filled with fear or apprehension.

Afraid to show emotion.

annoy

Cause annoyance in disturb especially by minor irritations.

Your damned cheerfulness has always annoyed me.

annoyance A thing that annoys someone; a nuisance.

The Council found him an annoyance.

annoyed Slightly angry; irritated.

He was **annoyed** at being woken up so early.

anxious Very eager or concerned to do something or for something to happen.

She was extremely **anxious** about her exams.

anxiously In a manner resulting from or revealing anxiety.

We are all waiting **anxiously** for any news.

Relating to perception or understanding.

Felt **apprehensive** about the consequences.

bother Cause annoyance in; disturb, especially by minor irritations.

A spot of bother.

Chagrin Feel distressed or humiliated.

Don t **concern** yourself old boy my lips are sealed.

distress

Bring into difficulties or distress especially financial hardship.

Vessels in *distress* on or near the coast.

disturb Interfere with the normal arrangement or functioning of.

Take the rollers out carefully so as not to **disturb** the curls too much.

disturbing Causing anxiety; worrying.

A disturbing amount of crime.

headache A thing or person that causes worry or difficulty; a problem.

An administrative **headache**.

inconvenience To cause inconvenience or discomfort to.

The **inconvenience** of having to change trains.

incubus A nightmare.

Debt is a big **incubus** in developing countries.



irritation A sudden outburst of anger.

Any food produced **irritation** of the stomach.

An act which is harmful or offensive to the public or a member of it and

offend Hurt the feelings of.

upsetThe act of upsetting something.
