<b>complimentary</b>	Conveying or resembling a compliment. <i>A <b>complimentary</b> remark.</i>
<b>discretion</b>	Freedom to act or judge on one’s own. <i>Local authorities should use their <b>discretion</b> in setting the charges.</i>
<b>disengage</b>	Separate or release (someone or something) from something to which they are attached or connected. <i>They <b>disengaged</b> themselves from the group.</i>
<b>dislodge</b>	Knock or force out of position. <i>The dentist <b>dislodged</b> the piece of food that had been stuck under my gums.</i>
<b>dismissal</b>	Permission to go; the sending away of someone. <i>The <b>dismissal</b> of an employee.</i>
<b>emancipate</b>	Free (someone) from slavery. <i>It is estimated that he <b>emancipated</b> 8 000 slaves.</i>
<b>emancipation</b>	The fact or process of being set free from legal, social, or political restrictions; liberation. <i>The <b>emancipation</b> of women.</i>
<b>exude</b>	(of a place) have a strong atmosphere of. <i>Slime <b>exudes</b> from the fungus.</i>
<b>gratis</b>	Costing nothing. <i><b>Gratis</b> books.</i>
<b>illimitable</b>	Without limits or an end. <i>The <b>illimitable</b> human capacity for evil.</i>
<b>inexpensive</b>	Not costing a great deal; cheap. <i><b>Inexpensive</b> family restaurants.</i>
<b>informal</b>	Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. <i>An <b>informal</b> atmosphere.</i>

<b>liberal</b>	A supporter of policies that are socially progressive and promote social welfare. <b>Liberal</b> amounts of wine had been consumed.
<b>liberate</b>	Grant freedom to; free from confinement. The drummer wearing a beret he <b>liberated</b> from Lord knows where.
<b>liberation</b>	The act of liberating someone or something. She worked for women's <b>liberation</b> .
<b>liberty</b>	The personification of liberty as a female figure. <b>Liberty</b> of opinion.
<b>loose</b>	Turn loose or free from restraint. He was told to avoid <b>loose</b> or light women.
<b>loosely</b>	In a way that is not rigidly organized. Kirby bowled <b>loosely</b> .
<b>manumit</b>	Release from slavery; set free. Old Angus had never <b>manumitted</b> a single slave.
<b>renewable</b>	(of a contract, agreement, etc.) capable of being renewed. <b>Renewable</b> energy such as solar energy is theoretically inexhaustible.
<b>separatist</b>	Relating to separatists or separatism. Religious <b>separatists</b> .
<b>unbridled</b>	Not restrained or controlled. A moment of <b>unbridled</b> ambition.
<b>unchecked</b>	Not examined or checked. Prices rose <b>unchecked</b> hitting the poor worst of all.
<b>unencumbered</b>	Not burdened with cares or responsibilities. Inherited an <b>unencumbered</b> estate.
<b>unfettered</b>	Not bound by shackles and chains. <b>Unfettered</b> artistic genius.
<b>unlimited</b>	(of a company) not limited. To start with a theory of <b>unlimited</b> freedom is to end up with <b>unlimited</b> despotism.
<b>unofficial</b>	Not officially established. <b>Unofficial</b> reports said that dozens of people were injured.
<b>unrestricted</b>	Not limited or restricted. <b>Unrestricted</b> verbs are usually stronger than those qualified by adverbs.
<b>untie</b>	Undo the ties of. They <b>untied</b> the prisoner.
