complimentary	Conveying or resembling a compliment. <i>A complimentary remark.</i>
<u>discretion</u>	Freedom to act or judge on one’s own. <i>Local authorities should use their discretion in setting the charges.</i>
<u>disengage</u>	Separate or release (someone or something) from something to which they are attached or connected. <i>They clung together for a moment then she disengaged herself.</i>
<u>dislodge</u>	Knock or force out of position. <i>The dentist dislodged the piece of food that had been stuck under my gums.</i>
<u>dismissal</u>	Permission to go; the sending away of someone. <i>The dismissal of an employee.</i>
emancipate	Free (someone) from slavery. <i>It is estimated that he emancipated 8 000 slaves.</i>
emancipation	The fact or process of being set free from legal, social, or political restrictions; liberation. <i>The social and political emancipation of women.</i>
exude	(of a place) have a strong atmosphere of. <i>Slime exudes from the fungus.</i>
gratis	Costing nothing. <i>Gratis books.</i>
illimitable	Without limits or an end. <i>The illimitable human capacity for evil.</i>
<u>inexpensive</u>	Not costing a great deal; cheap. <i>Inexpensive family restaurants.</i>
informal	Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. <i>An informal atmosphere.</i>

<u>liberal</u>	A supporter of policies that are socially progressive and promote social welfare. Liberal amounts of wine had been consumed.
<u>liberate</u>	Grant freedom to; free from confinement. The drummer s wearing a beret he s liberated from Lord knows where.
<u>liberation</u>	The act of liberating someone or something. She worked for women s liberation .
<u>liberty</u>	The personification of liberty as a female figure. Liberty of opinion.
<u>loose</u>	Turn loose or free from restraint. He was told to avoid loose or light women.
<u>loosely</u>	In a way that is not rigidly organized. Kirby bowled loosely .
manumit	Release from slavery; set free. Old Angus had never manumitted a single slave.
renewable	(of a contract, agreement, etc.) capable of being renewed. Renewable energy such as solar energy is theoretically inexhaustible.
separatist	Relating to separatists or separatism. Religious separatists .
<u>unbridled</u>	Not restrained or controlled. A moment of unbridled ambition.
<u>unchecked</u>	Not examined or checked. Prices rose unchecked hitting the poor worst of all.
unencumbered	Not burdened with cares or responsibilities. Inherited an unencumbered estate.
unfettered	Not bound by shackles and chains. Unfettered artistic genius.
unlimited	(of a company) not limited. To start with a theory of unlimited freedom is to end up with unlimited despotism.
<u>unofficial</u>	Not officially established. Unofficial reports said that dozens of people were injured.
unrestricted	Not limited or restricted. Unrestricted verbs are usually stronger than those qualified by adverbs.
untie	Undo the ties of. They untied the prisoner.

Make (someone) feel annoyed, frustrated, or worried, especially with trivial matters.

Vex the subject of the death penalty.
