acclamatory	Relating to or expressing acclamation.
admiring	Characterized by or expressive of admiration or warm approval. <i>The snowman has drawn many an admiring glance from villagers.</i>
adoring	Showing adoration. <i>Adoring grandparents.</i>
appreciative	Feeling or expressive of gratitude. <i>The team are very appreciative of your support.</i>
awed	Having or showing a feeling of mixed reverence and respect and wonder and dread. <i>I watched her in awed silence.</i>
commendatory	Serving to present something as suitable for approval or acceptance. <i>A commendatory grin.</i>
complimentary	Conveying or resembling a compliment. <i>A complimentary bottle of wine.</i>

<u>devoted</u>	Given over to the display, study, or discussion of. <i>A devoted husband and father.</i>
<u>devout</u>	Sincerely earnest. <i>Devout wishes for their success.</i>
dutiful	Conscientiously or obediently fulfilling one's duty. <i>A dutiful child.</i>
enthusiastic	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>He could be wildly enthusiastic about a project.</i>
eulogistic	Formally expressing praise.
<u>flattering</u>	Showing or representing to advantage. <i>The article began with some flattering words about us.</i>
<u>fulsome</u>	Unpleasantly and excessively suave or ingratiating in manner or speech. <i>The press are embarrassingly fulsome in their appreciation.</i>
<u>glowing</u>	Highly enthusiastic. <i>Glowing praise.</i>
godly	Showing great reverence for god. <i>Everything is black or white satanic or godly.</i>
laudatory	(of speech or writing) expressing praise and commendation. <i>Enthusiastic and laudatory articles.</i>
loving	Enjoying the specified activity or thing. <i>Her music loving son.</i>
praising	Full of or giving praise.
respectful	Feeling or manifesting veneration. <i>Respectful behavior.</i>
<u>reverent</u>	Showing great reverence for god. <i>Maintained a reverent silence.</i>
<u>reverential</u>	Of the nature of, due to, or characterized by reverence. <i>Their names are always mentioned in reverential tones.</i>
rhapsodic	Feeling great rapture or delight.
