**flattering**The article began with some **flattering** words about us.

fulsome Unpleasantly and excessively suave or ingratiating in manner or speech.

The press are embarrassingly **fulsome** in their appreciation.

glowing Highly enthusiastic.

**Glowing** praise.

**godly** Showing great reverence for god.

Everything is black or white satanic or **godly**.

laudatory (of speech or writing) expressing praise and commendation.

Enthusiastic and **laudatory** articles.

**loving** Enjoying the specified activity or thing.

Her music **loving** son.
