glorify Praise glorify or honor.

A football video **glorify**ing violence.

hallowed Made holy; consecrated.

The band will be in some **hallowed** and historic surroundings.

homage Special honour or respect shown publicly. *A man doing homage to his personal lord.*

idolatrous Relating to or practising idolatry; idol-worshipping.

Idolatrous religions.

The worship of idols; the worship of images that are not God.

Love unquestioningly and uncritically or to excess; venerate as an idol.
