believer A person who believes that a specified thing is right, effective, or acceptable.
*The relationship into which God invites **believers**.*

worshiper A person who has religious faith.

- *Edward was an unrepentant worshipper of power.*

- admiration** Respect and warm approval.
*A small token in **admiration** of your works.*
- admire** Look at (something impressive or attractive) with pleasure.
*I **admire** your courage.*
- adoration** Deep love and respect.
*He gave her a look of **adoration**.*
- adored** Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god).
***Adored** grandchildren.*
- benediction** The utterance of a blessing, especially at the end of a religious service.
*He said the **benediction**.*
- blessed** Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration.
*Our **blessed** land.*
- blessing** A ceremonial prayer invoking divine protection.
*It s a **blessing** we re alive.*

canonize	Declare (a dead person) to be a saint. <i>We have canonized freedom of speech as an absolute value overriding all others.</i>
<u>deference</u>	A disposition or tendency to yield to the will of others. <i>His deference to her wishes was very flattering.</i>
deify	Exalt to the position of a God. <i>These young men deify financial success.</i>
deity	Divine status, quality, or nature. <i>A ruler driven by delusions of deity.</i>
<u>divinity</u>	White creamy fudge made with egg whites. <i>Christ s divinity.</i>
esteem	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>I should esteem it a favour if you could speak to them.</i>
glorify	Praise glorify or honor. <i>A football video glorifying violence.</i>
<u>goddess</u>	A woman who is greatly admired, especially for her beauty. <i>He had an affair with a screen goddess.</i>
hallowed	Made holy; consecrated. <i>The band will be in some hallowed and historic surroundings.</i>
<u>homage</u>	Special honour or respect shown publicly. <i>A man doing homage to his personal lord.</i>
<u>idol</u>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>A soccer idol.</i>
idolatrous	Relating to or practising idolatry; idol-worshipping. <i>Idolatrous religions.</i>
idolatry	The worship of idols; the worship of images that are not God. <i>We must not allow our idolatry of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>
<u>idolize</u>	Love unquestioningly and uncritically or to excess; venerate as an idol. <i>He idolized his mother.</i>
obeisance	Bending the head or body or knee as a sign of reverence or submission or shame or greeting. <i>They paid obeisance to the Prince.</i>
orison	A prayer.
respect	Show respect towards. <i>Young people s lack of respect for their parents.</i>

- respectful** Feeling or manifesting veneration.
*A **respectful** glance.*
- revere** Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.
*C zanne s still lifes were **revered** by his contemporaries.*
- reverence** Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.
*Rituals showed honour and **reverence** for the dead.*
- theism** Belief in the existence of a god or gods, specifically of a creator who intervenes in the universe.
*There are many different forms of **theism**.*
- venerate** Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.
*We **venerate** genius.*
- veneration** Great respect; reverence.
*His respect for the law bordered on **veneration**.*
