### **Definitions of "Worshipper" as a noun**

**worshiper** A person who has religious faith.

- admiration** Respect and warm approval.  
*A small token in **admiration** of your works.*
- admire** Look at (something impressive or attractive) with pleasure.  
*I **admire** your courage.*
- adoration** Deep love and respect.  
*He gave her a look of **adoration**.*
- adored** Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god).  
***Adored** grandchildren.*
- benediction** The utterance of a blessing, especially at the end of a religious service.  
*He said the **benediction**.*
- blessed** Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration.  
*Our **blessed** land.*
- blessing** A ceremonial prayer invoking divine protection.  
*It s a **blessing** we re alive.*

<b>canonize</b>	Declare (a dead person) to be a saint. <i>We have <b>canonized</b> freedom of speech as an absolute value overriding all others.</i>
<b><u>deference</u></b>	A disposition or tendency to yield to the will of others. <i>His <b>deference</b> to her wishes was very flattering.</i>
<b>deify</b>	Exalt to the position of a God. <i>These young men <b>deify</b> financial success.</i>
<b>deity</b>	Divine status, quality, or nature. <i>A ruler driven by delusions of <b>deity</b>.</i>
<b><u>divinity</u></b>	White creamy fudge made with egg whites. <i>Christ s <b>divinity</b>.</i>
<b>esteem</b>	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>I should <b>esteem</b> it a favour if you could speak to them.</i>
<b>glorify</b>	Praise glorify or honor. <i>A football video <b>glorifying</b> violence.</i>
<b><u>goddess</u></b>	A woman who is greatly admired, especially for her beauty. <i>He had an affair with a screen <b>goddess</b>.</i>
<b>hallowed</b>	Made holy; consecrated. <i>The band will be in some <b>hallowed</b> and historic surroundings.</i>
<b><u>homage</u></b>	Special honour or respect shown publicly. <i>A man doing <b>homage</b> to his personal lord.</i>
<b><u>idol</u></b>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>A soccer <b>idol</b>.</i>
<b>idolatrous</b>	Relating to or practising idolatry; idol-worshipping. <i><b>Idolatrous</b> religions.</i>
<b>idolatry</b>	The worship of idols; the worship of images that are not God. <i>We must not allow our <b>idolatry</b> of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>
<b><u>idolize</u></b>	Love unquestioningly and uncritically or to excess; venerate as an idol. <i>He <b>idolized</b> his mother.</i>
<b>obeisance</b>	Bending the head or body or knee as a sign of reverence or submission or shame or greeting. <i>They paid <b>obeisance</b> to the Prince.</i>
<b>orison</b>	A prayer.
<b>respect</b>	Show respect towards. <i>Young people s lack of <b>respect</b> for their parents.</i>

- respectful** Feeling or manifesting veneration.  
*A **respectful** glance.*
- revere** Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.  
*C zanne s still lifes were **revered** by his contemporaries.*
- reverence** Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.  
*Rituals showed honour and **reverence** for the dead.*
- theism** Belief in the existence of a god or gods, specifically of a creator who intervenes in the universe.  
*There are many different forms of **theism**.*
- venerate** Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.  
*We **venerate** genius.*
- veneration** Great respect; reverence.  
*His respect for the law bordered on **veneration**.*
