Associations of "Woven" (30 Words)

braid	Form or weave into a braid or braids. <i>Braid a collar.</i>
cocoon	Wrap in or as if in a cocoon as for protection. <i>Americans are spending more time cocooning at home.</i>
cotton	Fabric woven from cotton fibers. <i>A cotton reel.</i>
crimp	A small connecting piece for crimping wires or lines together. <i>The crimp on take home pay has been even tighter since taxes were raised.</i>
crochet	Create by looping or crocheting. <i>Crochet a bedspread.</i>
curl	A curling movement. <i>Her fingers curled round the microphone.</i>
<u>deviate</u>	A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior. <i>The river was deviated to prevent flooding.</i>
flax	Fiber of the flax plant that is made into thread and woven into linen fabric. <i>A mill for the preparation and spinning of flax.</i>
hank	A ring for securing a staysail to the stay. <i>A thick hank of her blonde hair.</i>
interlace	Mingle or intersperse something with. <i>Discussion interlaced with esoteric mathematics.</i>
interweave	Weave or become woven together. <i>The branches met and interwove above his head.</i>
kink	Form a curl curve or kink. <i>A kink in the road.</i>
knit	Garment made of a knitted fabric. <i>An array of casual knits.</i>

knitting	The craft or action of knitting. <i>I put down my knitting.</i>
linen	White goods or clothing made with linen cloth. <i>He dealt in Irish linens.</i>
meander	To move or cause to move in a sinuous, spiral, or circular course. <i>The river flows in sweeping meanders.</i>
meandering	An act of wandering in a leisurely or aimless manner. <i>In the course of his meanderings through the city.</i>
ramble	Talk or write at length in a confused or inconsequential way. <i>Willy rambled on about Norman archways.</i>
sew	Make a garment by sewing. <i>The two sisters sewed their own dresses.</i>
silk	Thread or fabric made from the fibre produced by the silkworm. <i>His fur was soft and as smooth as silk.</i>
sinuous	Curved or curving in and out. <i>The sinuous grace of a cat.</i>
<u>strand</u>	Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue. <i>A strand of pearls.</i>
<u>string</u>	Provide with strings. <i>A string quartet.</i>
<u>thread</u>	A programming structure or process formed by linking a number of separate elements or subroutines especially each of the tasks executed concurrently in multithreading. <i>The Thames was a thread of silver below them.</i>
<u>twist</u>	Do the twist. <i>He handed her a twist of paper.</i>
warp	In weaving arrange yarn so as to form the warp of a piece of cloth. <i>Your judgement has been warped by your obvious dislike of him.</i>
weft	The yarn woven across the warp yarn in weaving. <i>Weft threads.</i>
wind	The act of winding or twisting. <i>An easterly wind.</i>
wool	Yarn or textile fibre made from wool. <i>A sampler in coloured wools.</i>
yarn	Tell or spin a yarn. <i>He had a bit of a yarn with the others.</i>
