| <b>braid</b>                   | Form or weave into a braid or braids.<br><i><b>Braid</b> a collar.</i>  |
| <b>cocoon</b>                  | Wrap in or as if in a cocoon as for protection.<br><i>Americans are spending more time <b>cocooning</b> at home.</i>                                      |
| <b>cotton</b>                  | Fabric woven from cotton fibers.<br><i>A <b>cotton</b> reel.</i>  |
| <b>crimp</b>                   | A small connecting piece for crimping wires or lines together.<br><i>The <b>crimp</b> on take home pay has been even tighter since taxes were raised.</i> |
| <b>crochet</b>                 | Create by looping or crocheting.<br><i><b>Crochet</b> a bedspread.</i>  |
| <b>curl</b>                    | A curling movement.<br><i>Her fingers <b>curled</b> round the microphone.</i>   |
| <a href="#"><b>deviate</b></a> | A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior.<br><i>The river was <b>deviated</b> to prevent flooding.</i>      |
| <b>flax</b>                    | Fiber of the flax plant that is made into thread and woven into linen fabric.<br><i>A mill for the preparation and spinning of <b>flax</b>.</i>           |
| <b>hank</b>                    | A ring for securing a staysail to the stay.<br><i>A thick <b>hank</b> of her blonde hair.</i>   |
| <b>interlace</b>               | Mingle or intersperse something with.<br><i>Discussion <b>interlaced</b> with esoteric mathematics.</i>   |
| <b>interweave</b>              | Weave or become woven together.<br><i>The branches met and interwove above his head.</i>  |
| <b>kink</b>                    | Form a curl curve or kink.<br><i>A <b>kink</b> in the road.</i>   |
| <b>knit</b>                    | Garment made of a knitted fabric.<br><i>An array of casual <b>knits</b>.</i>  |

| <b>knitting</b>      | The craft or action of knitting.<br><i>I put down my <b>knitting</b>.</i>  |
| <b>linen</b>         | White goods or clothing made with linen cloth.<br><i>He dealt in Irish <b>linens</b>.</i>  |
| <b>meander</b>       | To move or cause to move in a sinuous, spiral, or circular course.<br><i>The river flows in sweeping <b>meanders</b>.</i>  |
| <b>meandering</b>    | An act of wandering in a leisurely or aimless manner.<br><i>In the course of his <b>meanderings</b> through the city.</i>  |
| <b>ramble</b>        | Talk or write at length in a confused or inconsequential way.<br><i>Willy <b>rambled</b> on about Norman archways.</i>   |
| <b>sew</b>           | Make a garment by sewing.<br><i>The two sisters <b>sewed</b> their own dresses.</i>  |
| <b>silk</b>          | Thread or fabric made from the fibre produced by the silkworm.<br><i>His fur was soft and as smooth as <b>silk</b>.</i>  |
| <b>sinuous</b>       | Curved or curving in and out.<br><i>The <b>sinuous</b> grace of a cat.</i>   |
| <b><u>strand</u></b> | Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue.<br><i>A <b>strand</b> of pearls.</i>  |
| <b><u>string</u></b> | Provide with strings.<br><i>A <b>string</b> quartet.</i>   |
| <b><u>thread</u></b> | A programming structure or process formed by linking a number of separate elements or subroutines especially each of the tasks executed concurrently in multithreading.<br><i>The Thames was a <b>thread</b> of silver below them.</i> |
| <b><u>twist</u></b>  | Do the twist.<br><i>He handed her a <b>twist</b> of paper.</i>   |
| <b>warp</b>          | In weaving arrange yarn so as to form the warp of a piece of cloth.<br><i>Your judgement has been <b>warped</b> by your obvious dislike of him.</i>  |
| <b>weft</b>          | The yarn woven across the warp yarn in weaving.<br><i><b>Weft</b> threads.</i>   |
| <b>wind</b>          | The act of winding or twisting.<br><i>An easterly <b>wind</b>.</i>   |
| <b>wool</b>          | Yarn or textile fibre made from wool.<br><i>A sampler in coloured <b>wools</b>.</i>  |
| <b>yarn</b>          | Tell or spin a yarn.<br><i>He had a bit of a <b>yarn</b> with the others.</i>  |
