manifestation A symptom of an ailment.

A characteristic **manifestation** of Lyme disease.

A ghostly appearing figure.

A **phantom** ship.

A ghost or other supernatural being supposedly responsible for poltergeist physical disturbances such as making loud noises and throwing

objects about.

The state of being present; current existence.

My **presence** in the flat made her happy.



shade A lampshade.

After several trials he mixed the **shade** of pink that she wanted.

shadow An indication that something has been present.

He received little recognition working in the **shadow** of his father.

specter A mental representation of some haunting experience.

It aroused **specter**s from his past.

Something widely feared as a possible unpleasant or dangerous

spectre occurrence.

A dread of **spectre**s and witches affected every aspect of daily life.

spiritAnimation and energy in action or expression.

He was a leading **spirit** in the conference.

supernatural being Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively.

vision The images seen on a television screen.

Madame was a vision in black velvet.

- A sea breeze was sending a grey wraith of smoke up the slopes.

disembodied Separated from or existing without the body.

A disembodied ghost.

Drive out or attempt to drive out (a supposed evil spirit) from a person or

exorcise place.

Exorcise evil spirits.

extrasensory Seemingly outside normal sensory channels.

fiend The Devil.

Britain s most notorious sex **fiend**.

A spirit of Arabian folklore, frequently depicted as being imprisoned

genie within a bottle or oil lamp and as being capable of granting wishes when

summoned.

ghost Haunt like a ghost pursue.

How many books have you **ghost**written so far.

hallucinate Perceive what is not there; have illusions. *He starts hallucinating that he is Jesus.*

incorporeal Without material form or substance.

An **incorporeal** spirit.

malevolent Having or exerting a malignant influence.

The glint of dark **malevolent** eyes.

mettle The courage to carry on.

The team showed their true **mettle** in the second half.

(especially in ancient Egypt) a body of a human being or animal that has

mummy been ceremonially preserved by removal of the internal organs, treatment

with natron and resin, and wrapping in bandages.

The **mummy** of Tutankhamen.

obsessBe preoccupied with something.

He was **obsess**ed with the idea of revenge.

phantasmAn illusory likeness of something.

The cart seemed to glide like a terrible **phantasm**.



phantomSomething apparently sensed but having no physical reality.

He tried to clear the **phantom**s from his head and grasp reality.

The study of psychic phenomena.

He dulled his **psychic** pain with gin.

scared Made afraid.

We re both **scared** of spiders.

scary Frightening; causing fear.

It was **scary** the way they bonded with each other.

seance A meeting of spiritualists.

The **seance** was held in the medium s parlor.

soul Black American culture or ethnic pride.

It was bad news for some poor **soul**.

specter A ghostly appearing figure.

It aroused **specter**s from his past.

spectral Of or like a ghost.

Spectral emanations.

spirit Infuse with spirit.

A year after he left his **spirit** is still present.

(in Kantian philosophy) presupposed in and necessary to experience; a

transcendental priori.

The defining spirit or mood of a particular period of history as shown by
