### Definitions of "Wreath" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “wreath” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An arrangement of flowers, leaves, or stems fastened in a ring and used for decoration or for laying on a grave.*
- *A carved representation of a wreath.*
- *A snowdrift.*
- *A ring made of or resembling soft, twisted material.*
- *Flower arrangement consisting of a circular band of foliage or flowers for ornamental purposes.*
- *A curl or ring of smoke or cloud.*
- *A representation of a ring of twisted material below a crest (especially where it joins a helmet).*



### Synonyms of "Wreath" as a noun (4 Words)

**chaplet** Flower arrangement consisting of a circular band of foliage or flowers for ornamental purposes.

**coronal** A coronal consonant.

**garland** A literary anthology or miscellany.

**lei** A Polynesian garland of flowers.

## Associations of "Wreath" (30 Words)

<b>anther</b>	The part of the stamen that contains pollen; usually borne on a stalk.
<b>aster</b>	A plant of a large genus that includes the Michaelmas daisy, typically having purple or pink rayed flowers.
<b>azalea</b>	Any of numerous ornamental shrubs grown for their showy flowers of various colors.
<b><u>bloom</u></b>	The state or period of greatest beauty, freshness, or vigour. <i>Her face had lost its usual <b>bloom</b>.</i>
<b><u>blossom</u></b>	Mature or develop in a promising or healthy way. <i>Their friendship <b>blossomed</b> into romance.</i>

<b>cane</b>	Any plant that produces canes. <i>A <b>cane</b> coffee table.</i>
<b>christmas</b>	A Christian holiday celebrating the birth of Christ; a quarter day in England, Wales, and Ireland.
<b>conservatory</b>	A schoolhouse with special facilities for fine arts. <i>Keep plant cuttings in a frost free <b>conservatory</b> or greenhouse.</i>
<b>coronal</b>	A coronal consonant. <i><b>Coronal</b> imaging.</i>
<a href="#"><u>crown</u></a>	The part of a hat the vertex that covers the crown of the head. <i>She contained the urge to <b>crown</b> him.</i>
<b>daffodil</b>	A bulbous European plant which typically bears bright yellow flowers with a long trumpet-shaped centre (corona).
<b>daisy</b>	Used in names of other plants of the daisy family e g Michaelmas daisy Shasta daisy.
<b>efflorescence</b>	The formation of a powdery deposit on the surface of brickwork, rock, or other material as a result of loss of moisture on exposure to air. <i>The state is enjoying an incomparable cultural <b>efflorescence</b>.</i>
<b>efflorescent</b>	Bursting into flower.
<b>florist</b>	A shop where flowers and ornamental plants are sold. <i>The <b>florist</b> made up an attractive bouquet.</i>
<b>flourish</b>	Move or swing back and forth. <i>She entered with a great <b>flourish</b>.</i>
<b>flower</b>	Of a plant produce flowers bloom. <i>All right then <b>flower</b>.</i>
<b>flowering</b>	The time and process of budding and unfolding of blossoms. <i>The <b>flowering</b> of Viennese intellectual life.</i>
<b>herbaceous</b>	Characteristic of a nonwoody herb or plant part.
<b>lily</b>	Used in names of other plants with flowers or leaves similar to those of the lily e g arum lily.
<b>lotus</b>	White Egyptian lotus water lily of Egypt to southeastern Africa held sacred by the Egyptians. <i>A myth of creation states that Buddha was born of a thousand petalled gold <b>lotus</b>.</i>
<b>narcissus</b>	A beautiful young man who fell in love with his own reflection.
<b>nosegay</b>	A small bunch of flowers, typically one that is sweet-scented. <i>A <b>nosegay</b> worn at the waist or bodice.</i>

<b>petal</b>	Each of the segments of the corolla of a flower, which are modified leaves and are typically coloured.
<b>pollen</b>	A fine powdery substance typically yellow consisting of microscopic grains discharged from the male part of a flower or from a male cone Each grain contains a male gamete that can fertilize the female ovule to which pollen is transported by the wind insects or other animals.
<b>pollinator</b>	An insect or other agent that conveys pollen to a plant and so allows fertilization. <i>Bees are effective <b>pollinators</b> of fruit and vegetables.</i>
<b>precocity</b>	Intelligence achieved far ahead of normal developmental schedules.
<b>spring</b>	The ability to spring back strongly elasticity. <b>Spring</b> rain.
<b><u>throne</u></b>	Sit on the throne as a ruler. <i>The <b>throne</b> room.</i>
<b>tulip</b>	Any of numerous perennial bulbous herbs having linear or broadly lanceolate leaves and usually a single showy flower.
