**befuddled** Confused and vague; used especially of thinking.

He has an air of **befuddled** unworldliness.

drunken Habitually or frequently drunk.

His violent **drunken** father.

**incapable**Unable to do or achieve (something.

With the battery removed the car was **incapable** of being driven.

inebriated Stupefied or excited by a chemical substance (especially alcohol.

I got mildly **inebriated**.

Drunk or under the influence of drugs.

**intoxicated** Officials are reporting an increase in the number of **intoxicated** 

students requiring medical attention.

maudlin (of a book, film, or song) highly sentimental.

A maudlin jukebox tune.

**the worse for drink** Changed for the worse in health or fitness.



**tipsy** 

Unstable and prone to tip as if intoxicated. *A tipsy boat.* 

under the influence Located below or beneath something else.
