Definitions of "Wrecked" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “wrecked” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Destroyed in an accident.*
- *Under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs.*
- *Having been wrecked.*
- *Exhausted.*



Synonyms of "Wrecked" as an adjective (9 Words)

befuddled	Confused and vague; used especially of thinking. <i>He has an air of befuddled unworldliness.</i>
drunken	Habitually or frequently drunk. <i>His violent drunken father.</i>
<u>incapable</u>	Unable to do or achieve (something). <i>With the battery removed the car was incapable of being driven.</i>
<u>inebriated</u>	Stupefied or excited by a chemical substance (especially alcohol). <i>I got mildly inebriated.</i>
<u>intoxicated</u>	Drunk or under the influence of drugs. <i>Officials are reporting an increase in the number of intoxicated students requiring medical attention.</i>
maudlin	(of a book, film, or song) highly sentimental. <i>A maudlin jukebox tune.</i>
the worse for drink	Changed for the worse in health or fitness.

tipsy

Unstable and prone to tip as if intoxicated.
A **tipsy** boat.

under the influence Located below or beneath something else.



Usage Examples of "Wrecked" as an adjective

- A highway full of wrecked cars.
- A wrecked ship.
- An old wrecked barge.
- A wrecked marriage.
- They got wrecked on tequila.
