## Associations of "Write down" (30 Words)

<a href="#">anthology</a>	A collection of selected literary passages. <i>A double CD <b>anthology</b> of Moby Grape the legendary Sixties San Francisco band.</i>
<b>author</b>	The writings produced by a particular author. <i>He is the <b>author</b> of several books on the subject.</i>
<a href="#">bard</a>	A poet, traditionally one reciting epics and associated with a particular oral tradition. <i>Our national <b>bard</b> Robert Burns.</i>
<b>descend</b>	Move down (a slope or stairs). <i>As the winter darkness <b>descended</b> the fighting ceased.</i>
<b>descending</b>	Moving down a scale of quality. <i>The categories are listed in <b>descending</b> order of usefulness.</i>
<a href="#">descent</a>	A moral, social, or psychological decline. <i>A steep badly eroded <b>descent</b>.</i>
<b>disparagement</b>	A communication that belittles somebody or something.
<b>disquisition</b>	An elaborate analytical or explanatory essay or discussion. <i>Nothing can kill a radio show quicker than a <b>disquisition</b> on intertextual analysis.</i>
<b>downward</b>	Moving or leading towards a lower place or level. <i>Prices plunged <b>downward</b>.</i>
<b>emblazon</b>	Celebrate or extol publicly. <i>The Queen s coat of arms is <b>emblazoned</b> on the door panel.</i>
<b>enroll</b>	Register formally as a participant or member.
<a href="#">epic</a>	The genre of epics. <i>An <b>epic</b> voyage.</i>
<a href="#">falling</a>	Becoming lower or less in degree or value. <i>A <b>falling</b> market.</i>

<b>indite</b>	Write; compose. <i>He <b>indites</b> the wondrous tale of Our Lord.</i>
<b>low</b>	A low point level or figure. <i>Cook over <b>low</b> heat.</i>
<b>manuscript</b>	Handwritten book or document. <i>Early Gothic <b>manuscripts</b>.</i>
<b>marker</b>	(in team games) a player who stays close to an opponent to prevent them from getting or passing the ball. <i>A heavy line drawn by a <b>marker</b>.</i>
<b>nether</b>	Lower in position. <i>Gnawed his <b>nether</b> lip.</i>
<b>notebook</b>	A book with blank pages for recording notes or memoranda. <i>He copied the number into his <b>notebook</b>.</i>
<b>pen</b>	An electronic device like a pen used in conjunction with a writing surface to enter commands or data into a computer. <i>Olivia <b>penned</b> award winning poetry.</i>
<b>pencil</b>	Write draw or colour with a pencil. <i>A <b>pencil</b> of light.</i>
<b>poem</b>	A piece of writing in which the expression of feelings and ideas is given intensity by particular attention to diction (sometimes involving rhyme), rhythm, and imagery. <i>Lyric <b>poems</b>.</i>
<b>poet</b>	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more <b>poet</b> than academic because of his gift for language.</i>
<b>poetic</b>	Relating to or used in poetry. <i>Turner s vision of the rainbow was <b>poetic</b>.</i>
<b>poetics</b>	The art of writing poetry. <i>The terminology of traditional <b>poetics</b>.</i>
<b>prose</b>	A passage of prose for translation into a foreign language. <i>A short story in <b>prose</b>.</i>
<b>recognizance</b>	A bond by which a person undertakes before a court or magistrate to observe some condition, especially to appear when summoned. <i>The Lord Chancellor asked them to enter into <b>recognizances</b> to appear in court.</i>
<b>signpost</b>	Indicate a place with a signpost. <i>Most of the walks were well <b>signposted</b>.</i>
<b>submergence</b>	The process or state of being submerged in or covered with water. <i>Total <b>submergence</b> of plants results in heavy crop losses.</i>
