## Writer as a Noun

### Definitions of "Writer" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “writer” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person who writes books, stories, or articles as a job or occupation.*
- *Writes (books or stories or articles or the like) professionally (for pay).*
- *A device that writes data to a storage medium.*
- *A person who is able to write and has written something.*
- *A person who has written something or who writes in a particular way.*
- *A clerk, especially in the navy or in government offices.*
- *A scribe.*



## Synonyms of "Writer" as a noun (5 Words)

### author

The writings produced by a particular author.  
*The **authors** of the peace plan.*

### man of letters

A male person who plays a significant role (husband or lover or boyfriend) in the life of a particular woman.

### penman

A person, such as a clerk, who was employed to write by hand on behalf of others.  
*This talented **penman** s work.*

### woman of letters

A female person who plays a significant role (wife or mistress or girlfriend) in the life of a particular man.

### wordsmith

A fluent and prolific writer.





## Usage Examples of "Writer" as a noun

- *A CD writer.*
- *A writer of short stories.*
- *Dickens was a prolific writer.*
- *The writer of the letter.*



## Associations of "Writer" (30 Words)

### actor

A person who acts and gets things done.  
*In war one must be a good **actor**.*

### aesthete

One who professes great sensitivity to the beauty of art and nature.

### **author**

Be the author of.  
*He is the **author** of several books on the subject.*

### bard

A poet, traditionally one reciting epics and associated with a particular oral tradition.  
*Our national **bard** Robert Burns.*

### **biographer**

Someone who writes an account of a person's life.  
*An important **biographer** of contemporary artists.*

### **comic**

A professional performer who tells jokes and performs comical acts.  
*A **comic** monologue.*



<b>composer</b>	Someone who composes music as a profession. <i>Mozart was her favourite <b>composer</b>.</i>
<b>distinguished</b>	Used of a person's appearance or behavior; befitting an eminent person. <i>His <b>distinguished</b> bearing.</i>
<b>dramatist</b>	A person who writes plays.
<b>editor</b>	A person responsible for the editorial aspects of publication the person who determines the final content of a text especially of a newspaper or magazine. <i>A sports <b>editor</b>.</i>
<b>eminent</b>	(of a positive quality) present to a notable degree. <i>An <b>eminent</b> peak.</i>
<b>famous</b>	Known about by many people. <i>The country is <b>famous</b> for its natural beauty.</i>
<b>illustrious</b>	Well known, respected, and admired for past achievements. <i>An <b>illustrious</b> career.</i>
<b>journalist</b>	A writer for newspapers and magazines. <i>Foreign <b>journalists</b> had been expelled from the area.</i>
<b>leaflet</b>	Distribute leaflets to people or an area. <i>Tourists visiting the area are being <b>leafleted</b>.</i>
<b>libretto</b>	The words of an opera or musical play.
<b>lyricist</b>	A person who writes the words for songs.
<b>memoir</b>	An account of the author's personal experiences. <i>A revealing passage from Khrushchev's <b>memoirs</b>.</i>
<b>minstrel</b>	A performer in a minstrel show. <i>They listened to the <b>minstrels</b> singing songs of knightly prowess.</i>
<b>novelist</b>	One who writes novels.
<b>operetta</b>	A short opera usually on a light or humorous theme and typically having spoken dialogue Notable composers of operettas include Offenbach Johan Strauss Franz Leh r and Gilbert and Sullivan.
<b>pamphleteer</b>	Write and issue political or controversial pamphlets. <i>The right to <b>pamphleteer</b> and post bills anonymously is as important today as it was three centuries ago.</i>
<b>pen</b>	An electronic device like a pen used in conjunction with a writing surface to enter commands or data into a computer. <i>She was forced to support herself by the <b>pen</b>.</i>
<b>performer</b>	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus <b>performer</b>.</i>

<b>playwright</b>	A person who writes plays.
<b>poet</b>	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more <b>poet</b> than academic because of his gift for language.</i>
<b>renowned</b>	Widely known and esteemed. <i>A <b>renowned</b> painter.</i>
<b><u>theater</u></b>	The art of writing and producing plays. <i>He served in the Vietnam <b>theater</b> for three years.</i>
<b>tragedian</b>	A writer (especially a playwright) who writes tragedies.
<b><u>write</u></b>	Underwrite an insurance policy. <i>If I could <b>write</b> the beauty of your eyes.</i>
