Associations of "Written" (30 Words)

acronym	An abbreviation formed from the initial letters of other words and pronounced as a word (e.g. ASCII, NASA). <i>The word scuba is an acronym for s elf c ontained u nderwater b reathing a pparatus.</i>
address	Access or locate by address. <i>She addressed my father as Mr Stevens.</i>
aforementioned	Denoting a thing or person previously mentioned. <i>Works of all the aforementioned authors.</i>
aforsaid	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of.
alphabetic	Relating to or expressed by a writing system that uses an alphabet. <i>An alphabetic arrangement.</i>
announcement	The action of making an announcement. <i>The announcement of the decision of the European Parliament.</i>

congratulatory	Conveying good wishes or praise to someone in response to an achievement or special occasion. <i>The usual congratulatory crowd was conspicuously absent.</i>
correspondence	Letters, emails, etc. sent or received. <i>The results of two tests were in correspondence.</i>
cursive	Rapid handwriting in which letters are set down in full and are cursively connected within words without lifting the writing implement from the paper. <i>Cursive script.</i>
declarative	A declarative sentence or phrase. <i>Declarative statements.</i>
dissertation	A long essay on a particular subject, especially one written for a university degree or diploma. <i>A dissertation on the novels of the Brontë sisters.</i>
document	Support or accompany with documentation. <i>The parents documented every step of their child's development.</i>
email	Send an email to someone. <i>Email messages.</i>
encyclical	A letter from the pope sent to all Roman Catholic bishops throughout the world. <i>An encyclical letter.</i>
handwriting	A person's particular style of writing. <i>Her handwriting was small and neat.</i>
holographic	Written entirely in one's own hand. <i>Holographic storage discs.</i>
indicative	The indicative mood. <i>Indicative mood.</i>
informing	To furnish incriminating evidence to an officer of the law (usually in return for favors).
letter	Win an athletic letter. <i>Your personality matters far more than letters after your name.</i>
message	Send a message to someone especially by email text app or other electronic means. <i>She messaged the committee.</i>
pager	An electronic device that generates a series of beeps when the person carrying it is being paged.

postscript	An extra piece of information about an event that is added after it has happened. <i>He added a postscript Leaving tomorrow.</i>
promulgation	The official announcement of a new law or ordinance whereby the law or ordinance is put into effect. <i>The promulgation was written in English.</i>
<u>relay</u>	A signal or broadcast transmitted by a relay. <i>Gangs of workers were sent in relays.</i>
report	An employee who reports to another employee. <i>Undisclosed illegalities are reported to the company s directors.</i>
sender	Someone who transmits a message. <i>Evidence submitted late will be returned to the sender.</i>
<u>subliminal</u>	Below the threshold of conscious perception.
telegram	A message sent by telegraph and then delivered in written or printed form, used in the UK only for international messages since 1981.
telegraphic	Of or relating to or transmitted by telegraph. <i>Telegraphic speech.</i>
<u>text</u>	Send someone a text message. <i>There were more than a thousand words of text.</i>
