## Associations of "Wrote" (30 Words)

<b>afflatus</b>	A strong creative impulse; divine inspiration. <i>Divine <b>afflatus</b>.</i>
<b>author</b>	Be the author of. <i>I had to read <b>authors</b> I disliked.</i>
<b>bard</b>	Shakespeare. <i>Our national <b>bard</b> Robert Burns.</i>
<b>dictation</b>	Words that are dictated. <i>Passages for <b>dictation</b>.</i>
<b>essay</b>	An attempt or effort. <i>Donald <b>essayed</b> a smile.</i>
<b>indite</b>	Write; compose. <i>He <b>indites</b> the wondrous tale of Our Lord.</i>
<b>interpolation</b>	The insertion of something of a different nature into something else. <i>As the evening progressed their <b>interpolations</b> became more ridiculous.</i>
<b>journal</b>	Write in a journal or diary. <i>While abroad he had kept a <b>journal</b>.</i>
<b>manuscript</b>	Handwritten book or document. <i>Her autobiography remained in <b>manuscript</b>.</i>
<b>minstrel</b>	A performer in a minstrel show. <i>The exaggerated dialect of blackface <b>minstrels</b>.</i>
<b>notebook</b>	A book with blank pages for recording notes or memoranda. <i>He copied the number into his <b>notebook</b>.</i>
<b>ode</b>	A lyric poem, typically one in the form of an address to a particular subject, written in varied or irregular metre.
<b>pen</b>	An electronic device like a pen used in conjunction with a writing surface to enter commands or data into a computer. <i>Olivia <b>penned</b> award winning poetry.</i>

<b><u>poem</u></b>	A piece of writing in which the expression of feelings and ideas is given intensity by particular attention to diction (sometimes involving rhyme), rhythm, and imagery. <i>Lytic <b>poems</b>.</i>
<b>poet</b>	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more <b>poet</b> than academic because of his gift for language.</i>
<b><u>poetic</u></b>	Of or relating to poets. <i>A <b>poetic</b> romance.</i>
<b>poetics</b>	Study of poetic works. <i>Both <b>poetics</b> and rhetoric make use of narrative structure.</i>
<b><u>prose</u></b>	A passage of prose for translation into a foreign language. <i>A short story in <b>prose</b>.</i>
<b>quatrain</b>	A stanza of four lines, especially one having alternate rhymes.
<b><u>script</u></b>	Write a script for. <i>The playwright <b>scripted</b> the movie.</i>
<b>shorthand</b>	A method of rapid writing by means of abbreviations and symbols used especially for taking dictation The major systems of shorthand currently in use are those devised in 1837 by Sir Isaac Pitman and in the US in 1888 by John R Gregg 1867 1948. <i><b>Shorthand</b> notes.</i>
<b>sonnet</b>	Compose a sonnet. <i>And in delightful Tones sit <b>sonneting</b>.</i>
<b><u>spell</u></b>	Place under a spell. <i>She <b>spelled</b> her husband at the wheel.</i>
<b>stenographer</b>	A person whose job is to transcribe speech in shorthand. <i>A court <b>stenographer</b>.</i>
<b><u>text</u></b>	A text message. <i>An organic chemistry <b>text</b>.</i>
<b><u>transcribe</u></b>	Synthesize (RNA) using a template of existing DNA (or vice versa), so that the genetic information is copied. <i>Polymerases <b>transcribe</b> it into a long RNA molecule.</i>
<b>transcription</b>	An arrangement of a piece of music for a different instrument, voice, or group of these. <i>A <b>transcription</b> for voice and lute.</i>
<b>verse</b>	Compose verses or put into verse. <i>She <b>versed</b> herself in Roman archeology.</i>
<b><u>writer</u></b>	Writes (books or stories or articles or the like) professionally (for pay). <i>Dickens was a prolific <b>writer</b>.</i>
