Associations of "Wrote" (30 Words)

afflatus	A strong creative impulse; divine inspiration. <i>Divine afflatus.</i>
author	Be the author of. <i>I had to read authors I disliked.</i>
bard	Shakespeare. <i>Our national bard Robert Burns.</i>
dictation	Words that are dictated. <i>Passages for dictation.</i>
essay	An attempt or effort. <i>Donald essayed a smile.</i>
indite	Write; compose. <i>He indites the wondrous tale of Our Lord.</i>
interpolation	The insertion of something of a different nature into something else. <i>As the evening progressed their interpolations became more ridiculous.</i>
journal	Write in a journal or diary. <i>While abroad he had kept a journal.</i>
manuscript	Handwritten book or document. <i>Her autobiography remained in manuscript.</i>
minstrel	A performer in a minstrel show. <i>The exaggerated dialect of blackface minstrels.</i>
notebook	A book with blank pages for recording notes or memoranda. <i>He copied the number into his notebook.</i>
ode	A lyric poem, typically one in the form of an address to a particular subject, written in varied or irregular metre.
pen	An electronic device like a pen used in conjunction with a writing surface to enter commands or data into a computer. <i>Olivia penned award winning poetry.</i>

<u>poem</u>	A piece of writing in which the expression of feelings and ideas is given intensity by particular attention to diction (sometimes involving rhyme), rhythm, and imagery. <i>Lytic poems.</i>
poet	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more poet than academic because of his gift for language.</i>
<u>poetic</u>	Of or relating to poets. <i>A poetic romance.</i>
poetics	Study of poetic works. <i>Both poetics and rhetoric make use of narrative structure.</i>
<u>prose</u>	A passage of prose for translation into a foreign language. <i>A short story in prose.</i>
quatrain	A stanza of four lines, especially one having alternate rhymes.
<u>script</u>	Write a script for. <i>The playwright scripted the movie.</i>
shorthand	A method of rapid writing by means of abbreviations and symbols used especially for taking dictation The major systems of shorthand currently in use are those devised in 1837 by Sir Isaac Pitman and in the US in 1888 by John R Gregg 1867 1948. <i>Shorthand notes.</i>
sonnet	Compose a sonnet. <i>And in delightful Tones sit sonneting.</i>
<u>spell</u>	Place under a spell. <i>She spelled her husband at the wheel.</i>
stenographer	A person whose job is to transcribe speech in shorthand. <i>A court stenographer.</i>
<u>text</u>	A text message. <i>An organic chemistry text.</i>
<u>transcribe</u>	Synthesize (RNA) using a template of existing DNA (or vice versa), so that the genetic information is copied. <i>Polymerases transcribe it into a long RNA molecule.</i>
transcription	An arrangement of a piece of music for a different instrument, voice, or group of these. <i>A transcription for voice and lute.</i>
verse	Compose verses or put into verse. <i>She versed herself in Roman archeology.</i>
<u>writer</u>	Writes (books or stories or articles or the like) professionally (for pay). <i>Dickens was a prolific writer.</i>
