afternoon	In the afternoon every afternoon. <i>She worked on Tuesday afternoons.</i>
annually	Once a year; every year. <i>They travel to China annually.</i>
april	The month following March and preceding May.
concomitant	A phenomenon that naturally accompanies or follows something. <i>She loved travel with all its concomitant worries.</i>
daily	The first prints from cinematographic takes; the rushes. <i>A daily paper.</i>
date	Establish or ascertain the date of an object or event. <i>The package is dated November 24.</i>
day	Daylight. <i>In Shakespeare s day.</i>
ensuing	Following immediately and as a result of what went before. <i>Ensuing events confirmed the prediction.</i>
february	The month following January and preceding March.
friday	The sixth day of the week; the fifth working day.
january	The first month of the year; begins 10 days after the winter solstice.
july	The month following June and preceding August.
late	Later than usual or than expected. <i>She was half an hour late for her lunch appointment.</i>
march	Genre of music written for marching. <i>He began to hum a funeral march.</i>
may	Expressing possibility. <i>May she rest in peace.</i>
monday	The second day of the week; the first working day.

month	A period of time between the same dates in successive calendar months. <i>The first six months of 1992.</i>
morning	Every morning. <i>Mornings she d sleep late.</i>
november	The month following October and preceding December.
october	The month following September and preceding November.
periodical	A publication that appears at fixed intervals. <i>Britain s best periodical art magazine.</i>
periodicity	The quality of recurring at regular intervals. <i>The periodicity of the sunspot cycle.</i>
september	The month following August and preceding October.
sunday	United States evangelist (1862-1935).
thursday	The fifth day of the week; the fourth working day.
time	A point of time as measured in hours and minutes past midnight or noon. <i>He was doing time for fraud.</i>
tuesday	The third day of the week; the second working day.
wednesday	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
weekday	Any day except Sunday (and sometimes except Saturday). <i>The weekday rush hour.</i>
weekend	Spend the weekend. <i>A weekend break.</i>
