Yearly as a Noun

Definitions of "Yearly" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “yearly” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A reference book that is published regularly once every year.*



Synonyms of "Yearly" as a noun (2 Words)

annual An annual plant.
*Sow **annuals** in spring.*

yearbook An annual publication giving current information and listing events or aspects of the previous year, especially in a particular field.
*The Rugby Union **Yearbook**.*



Yearly as an Adjective

Definitions of "Yearly" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "yearly" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Occurring or payable every year.*
- *Done, produced, or occurring once a year or every year.*



Synonyms of "Yearly" as an adjective (3 Words)

annual

Calculated over or covering a period of a year.
*An **annual** report.*

each year

Every one considered individually.

every year Each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception.

Usage Examples of "Yearly" as an adjective

- *Yearly visits to Africa.*
- *Annual (or yearly) income.*
- *Yearly medical examinations.*

Yearly as an Adverb

Definitions of "Yearly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "yearly" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Without missing a year.*
- *Once a year or every year.*

Synonyms of "Yearly" as an adverb (5 Words)

annually Once a year; every year.

*The prize is awarded **annually**.*

by the year In reserve; not for immediate use.

each year To or from every one of two or more (considered individually).

once a year At a previous time.

per annum By the year; every year (usually with reference to a sum of money paid or received).

Usage Examples of "Yearly" as an adverb

- *Rent was paid yearly.*

Associations of "Yearly" (30 Words)

almanac An annual calendar containing important dates and statistical information such as astronomical data and tide tables.

annual	An annual plant. <i>Trade journals annuals and directories.</i>
annually	Once a year; every year. <i>They travel to China annually.</i>
biannual	Occurring twice a year. <i>The biannual meeting of the planning committee.</i>
biennial	A biennial plant. <i>A biennial life cycle.</i>
bimonthly	Occurring every two months. <i>The magazine appears bimonthly.</i>
biweekly	Occurring every two weeks. <i>An English language biweekly.</i>
celebration	The public performance of a sacrament or solemn ceremony with all appropriate ritual. <i>A birthday celebration.</i>
cyclical	Recurring in cycles. <i>The cyclical nature of the cement industry.</i>
daily	Every day; without missing a day. <i>Daily routine.</i>
day-to-day	The time after sunrise and before sunset while it is light outside.
diurnal	Daily; of each day. <i>Diurnal aberration.</i>
memorial	A recognition of meritorious service. <i>A memorial service in the dead man s honour.</i>
monthly	A periodical that is published every month (or 12 issues per year). <i>The monthly newsletter.</i>
oft	Many times at short intervals. <i>An oft quoted tenet.</i>
perennial	A perennial plant. <i>His perennial distrust of the media.</i>
perennially	In a perennial manner; repeatedly. <i>Perennially popular destinations like Rome.</i>
periodic	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>Periodic feelings of anxiety.</i>
periodical	A publication that appears at fixed intervals. <i>Britain s best periodical art magazine.</i>

periodically	From time to time; occasionally. <i>The lamps were periodically switched on and off at 30 minute intervals.</i>
quarterly	In three month intervals. <i>A quarterly newsletter is distributed to members.</i>
<u>recurrent</u>	(of a nerve or blood vessel) turning back so as to reverse direction. <i>She had a recurrent dream about falling.</i>
regular	In accord with regular practice or procedure. <i>Regular bus departures.</i>
regularity	The state or quality of being regular. <i>He came to see her with increasing regularity.</i>
<u>regularly</u>	In a regular way without variation. <i>Regularly spaced buildings.</i>
semiannual	Occurring or payable twice each year.
tercentenary	The 300th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>The conference celebrates the tercentenary of the Scottish architect William Adam.</i>
triennial	A visitation of an Anglican diocese by its bishop every three years. <i>The triennial meeting of the Association.</i>
<u>weekly</u>	A periodical that is published every week (or 52 issues per year). <i>A weekly visit.</i>
<u>year</u>	A period of time occupying a regular part of a calendar year that is used for some particular activity. <i>It s almost a year since his heart attack.</i>
