#### Synonyms of "Yearly" as an adverb (5 Words)

annually Once a year; every year.

The prize is awarded annually.

by the year In reserve; not for immediate use.

**each year** To or from every one of two or more (considered individually.

once a year At a previous time.

**per annum** By the year; every year (usually with reference to a sum of money paid or received.
