- Be filled with compassion or warm feeling.
- Have a desire for something or someone who is not present.

languish She still **languish**ed after Richard.

Utter while panting as if out of breath. pant He was **pant**ing when he reached the top.

Feel the need to drink. thirst

An opponent **thirst**ing for revenge.

Hunt or look for want for a particular reason.

want. I want my own room.


