<b>active</b>	Capable of erupting. <i>A politically <b>active</b> student body.</i>
<b>animated</b>	(of a film or image) made using animation techniques. <i><b>Animated</b> puppets.</i>
<b>buoyant</b>	Cheerful and optimistic. <i><b>Buoyant</b> balsawood boats.</i>
<b><u>cheerful</u></b>	Being full of or promoting cheer; having or showing good spirits. <i>A <b>cheerful</b> greeting.</i>
<b>dynamic</b>	Of or relating to dynamics. <i>A <b>dynamic</b> young advertising executive.</i>
<b><u>effervescent</u></b>	Giving off bubbles. <i><b>Effervescent</b> young people.</i>
<b><u>energetic</u></b>	Possessing or exerting or displaying energy. <i><b>Energetic</b> X rays.</i>

<b>enthusiastic</b>	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>He could be wildly <b>enthusiastic</b> about a project.</i>
<b>exuberant</b>	Full of energy, excitement, and cheerfulness. <i><b>Exuberant</b> compliments.</i>
<b>full of life</b>	Having marked deepness and body.
<b>high-spirited</b>	Joyously unrestrained.
<b>outgoing</b>	Leaving a place or a position. <i>The <b>outgoing</b> Prime Minister.</i>
<b>spirited</b>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A <b>spirited</b> dance.</i>
<b>sprightly</b>	(especially of an old person) lively; full of energy. <i>A <b>sprightly</b> dance.</i>
<b>spry</b>	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>He continued to look <b>spry</b> and active well into his eighties.</i>
<b>vernal</b>	Suggestive of youth; vigorous and fresh. <i>The <b>vernal</b> freshness of the land.</i>
<b>vibrant</b>	Vigorous and animated. <i>His <b>vibrant</b> voice.</i>
<b>vigorous</b>	Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity. <i><b>Vigorous</b> aerobic exercise.</i>
<b>vivacious</b>	Vigorous and animated. <i>A charming and <b>vivacious</b> hostess.</i>
<b>young</b>	Relating to or consisting of young people. <i>She s very <b>young</b> for her age.</i>

## Associations of "Youthful" (30 Words)

- adolescence** The time period between the beginning of puberty and adulthood.  
*Mary spent her childhood and **adolescence** in Europe.*
- adolescent** An adolescent boy or girl.  
*The books are aimed at children and **adolescents**.*
- adult** Suitable only for adults used euphemistically to refer to a sexually explicit film book or magazine.  
*An effort to be **adult** and civilized.*
- boy** Men who mix socially or who belong to a particular group, team, or profession.  
*A four year old **boy**.*
- childhood** The state of a child between infancy and adolescence.  
*A **childhood** friend.*
- cub** Give birth to cubs.  
*His sons are as yet mere **cubs**.*



<b>delinquency</b>	Neglect of one's duty. <i>He inherited his <b>delinquency</b> from his father.</i>
<b>delinquent</b>	A delinquent person. <i><b>Delinquent</b> minors.</i>
<b>girl</b>	A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>The <b>girls</b> were just learning to ride a tricycle.</i>
<b>immature</b>	(used of living things especially persons) in an early period of life or development or growth. <i>Many of the fish caught are <b>immature</b>.</i>
<b>infancy</b>	The early stage of growth or development. <i>A son who died in <b>infancy</b>.</i>
<b>junior</b>	A child attending a junior school. <i>A <b>junior</b> minister.</i>
<b>juvenile</b>	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>The law relating to the sentencing of <b>juveniles</b>.</i>
<b>kid</b>	A young person of either sex. <i>After we relaxed we just <b>kidded</b> around.</i>
<b>lad</b>	A stable worker (regardless of age or sex). <i>She wouldn't let him go out with the <b>lads</b> any more.</i>
<b>laddie</b>	A male child (a familiar term of address to a boy). <i>He's just a wee <b>laddie</b>.</i>
<b>maidenhood</b>	The childhood of a girl. <i>Most brides wear white to symbolize <b>maidenhood</b>.</i>
<b>maturation</b>	The process of an individual organism growing organically; a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>Pod <b>maturation</b>.</i>
<b>precocious</b>	(of a child) having developed certain abilities or inclinations at an earlier age than is usual or expected. <i><b>Precocious</b> flowers appear before the leaves as in some species of magnolias.</i>
<b>puberty</b>	The time of life when sex glands become functional. <i>The onset of <b>puberty</b>.</i>
<b>reformatory</b>	Correctional institution for the detention and discipline and training of young or first offenders. <i><b>Reformatory</b> punishment.</i>
<b>schoolgirl</b>	Characteristic of or associated with schoolgirls. <i><b>Schoolgirl</b> French.</i>

<b>son</b>	The divine word of God the second person in the Trinity incarnate in Jesus. <i>Sons of the church.</i>
<b>stripling</b>	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity. <i>He s a mere <b>stripling</b>.</i>
<b>teen</b>	A teenager. <i>A <b>teen</b> idol.</i>
<b>teenage</b>	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. <i><b>Teenage</b> magazines.</i>
<b>teenager</b>	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity.
<b>young</b>	Relating to or consisting of young people. <i>A <b>young</b> industry.</i>
<b>youngster</b>	A child, young person, or young animal. <i>Tiddler is a British term for <b>youngster</b>.</i>
