animated	(of a film or image) made using animation techniques. <i>Animated puppets.</i>
buoyant	Cheerful and optimistic. <i>Buoyant balsawood boats.</i>
<u>cheerful</u>	Being full of or promoting cheer; having or showing good spirits. <i>A cheerful greeting.</i>
dynamic	Of or relating to dynamics. <i>A dynamic young advertising executive.</i>
<u>effervescent</u>	Giving off bubbles. <i>Effervescent young people.</i>
<u>energetic</u>	Possessing or exerting or displaying energy. <i>Energetic X rays.</i>

enthusiastic	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>He could be wildly enthusiastic about a project.</i>
exuberant	Full of energy, excitement, and cheerfulness. <i>Exuberant compliments.</i>
full of life	Having marked deepness and body.
high-spirited	Joyously unrestrained.
outgoing	Leaving a place or a position. <i>The outgoing Prime Minister.</i>
spirited	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited dance.</i>
sprightly	(especially of an old person) lively; full of energy. <i>A sprightly dance.</i>
spry	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>He continued to look spry and active well into his eighties.</i>
vernal	Suggestive of youth; vigorous and fresh. <i>The vernal freshness of the land.</i>
vibrant	Vigorous and animated. <i>His vibrant voice.</i>
vigorous	Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity. <i>Vigorous aerobic exercise.</i>
vivacious	Vigorous and animated. <i>A charming and vivacious hostess.</i>
young	Relating to or consisting of young people. <i>She s very young for her age.</i>

Associations of "Youthful" (30 Words)

- adolescence** The time period between the beginning of puberty and adulthood.
*Mary spent her childhood and **adolescence** in Europe.*
- adolescent** An adolescent boy or girl.
*The books are aimed at children and **adolescents**.*
- adult** Suitable only for adults used euphemistically to refer to a sexually explicit film book or magazine.
*An effort to be **adult** and civilized.*
- boy** Men who mix socially or who belong to a particular group, team, or profession.
*A four year old **boy**.*
- childhood** The state of a child between infancy and adolescence.
*A **childhood** friend.*
- cub** Give birth to cubs.
*His sons are as yet mere **cubs**.*

delinquency	Neglect of one's duty. <i>He inherited his delinquency from his father.</i>
delinquent	A delinquent person. <i>Delinquent minors.</i>
girl	A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>The girls were just learning to ride a tricycle.</i>
immature	(used of living things especially persons) in an early period of life or development or growth. <i>Many of the fish caught are immature.</i>
infancy	The early stage of growth or development. <i>A son who died in infancy.</i>
junior	A child attending a junior school. <i>A junior minister.</i>
juvenile	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>The law relating to the sentencing of juveniles.</i>
kid	A young person of either sex. <i>After we relaxed we just kidded around.</i>
lad	A stable worker (regardless of age or sex). <i>She wouldn't let him go out with the lads any more.</i>
laddie	A male child (a familiar term of address to a boy). <i>He's just a wee laddie.</i>
maidenhood	The childhood of a girl. <i>Most brides wear white to symbolize maidenhood.</i>
maturation	The process of an individual organism growing organically; a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>Pod maturation.</i>
precocious	(of a child) having developed certain abilities or inclinations at an earlier age than is usual or expected. <i>Precocious flowers appear before the leaves as in some species of magnolias.</i>
puberty	The time of life when sex glands become functional. <i>The onset of puberty.</i>
reformatory	Correctional institution for the detention and discipline and training of young or first offenders. <i>Reformatory punishment.</i>
schoolgirl	Characteristic of or associated with schoolgirls. <i>Schoolgirl French.</i>

son	The divine word of God the second person in the Trinity incarnate in Jesus. <i>Sons of the church.</i>
stripling	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity. <i>He s a mere stripling.</i>
teen	A teenager. <i>A teen idol.</i>
teenage	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. <i>Teenage magazines.</i>
teenager	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity.
young	Relating to or consisting of young people. <i>A young industry.</i>
youngster	A child, young person, or young animal. <i>Tiddler is a British term for youngster.</i>
