Associations of "Zeitgeist" (30 Words)

aeon	A divine power or nature emanating from the Supreme Being and playing various roles in the operation of the universe. <i>The Precambrian aeon.</i>
ago	Before the present; earlier (used with a measurement of time). <i>Agone is an archaic word for ago.</i>
anachronistic	Chronologically misplaced. <i>English public schools are anachronistic.</i>
annually	Once a year; every year. <i>They travel to China annually.</i>
<u>antebellum</u>	Occurring or existing before a particular war, especially the US Civil War. <i>The conventions of the antebellum South.</i>
climacteric	Occurring at characteristic of or undergoing the climacteric in women menopausal. <i>Most women do not experience significant psychological problems at the climacteric.</i>
coeval	A person of roughly the same age as oneself; a contemporary. <i>These lavas were coeval with the volcanic activity.</i>
dalliance	A casual romantic or sexual relationship. <i>Jack was not averse to an occasional dalliance with a pretty girl.</i>
deferment	The postponement of a person's conscription. <i>He was granted five deferments from the draft.</i>
<u>enduring</u>	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>An enduring disposition.</i>
<u>ensuing</u>	Occurring afterwards or as a result. <i>There were repeated clashes in the ensuing days.</i>
eon	(Gnosticism) a divine power or nature emanating from the Supreme Being and playing various roles in the operation of the universe. <i>Oh that happened eons ago.</i>

epoch	A particular period of time in history or a person's life. <i>These events marked an epoch in their history.</i>
era	Baseball a measure of a pitcher's effectiveness calculated as the average number of earned runs allowed by the pitcher for every nine innings pitched. <i>The Mesozoic era.</i>
hour	A time specified on the twenty four hour clock. <i>We live an hour from the airport.</i>
interregnum	An interval or pause between two periods of office or other things. <i>The interregnum between the discovery of radioactivity and its detailed understanding.</i>
meantime	Meanwhile. <i>In the meantime the police were notified.</i>
meanwhile	During the intervening time. <i>Meanwhile I will not think about the problem.</i>
mesozoic	From 230 million to 63 million years ago.
millennial	A person reaching young adulthood in the early 21st century. <i>Generation Xers and millennials have some real gripes about the world their parents constructed.</i>
neolithic	Of or relating to the most recent period of the Stone Age (following the mesolithic).
neonatal	Relating to or affecting the infant during the first month after birth. <i>Special attention is given to mortality in the neonatal period.</i>
paleolithic	Second part of the Stone Age beginning about 750,000 to 500,000 years BC and lasting until the end of the last ice age about 8,500 years BC. <i>Paleolithic artifacts.</i>
phase	A structure containing two verbs in a phase. <i>The invertebrate residents of the tundra pass the winter in dormant phase.</i>
proterozoic	From 2,500 to 544 million years ago; bacteria and fungi; primitive multicellular organisms. <i>Proterozoic life forms.</i>
retrospective	An exhibition of a representative selection of an artist's life work. <i>Retrospective self justification.</i>
span	The wingspan of an aircraft or a bird. <i>The parking lot spans 3 acres.</i>
spirit	Infuse with spirit. <i>Shrines to nature spirits.</i>

while

At the same time meanwhile.
