| <b>anachronistic</b> | Chronologically misplaced.<br><i>English public schools are <b>anachronistic</b>.</i>  |
| <b>annually</b>      | Once a year; every year.<br><i>They travel to China <b>annually</b>.</i>   |
| <b>antebellum</b>    | Occurring or existing before a particular war, especially the US Civil War.<br><i>The conventions of the <b>antebellum</b> South.</i>  |
| <b>climacteric</b>   | Occurring at characteristic of or undergoing the climacteric in women menopausal.<br><i>Most women do not experience significant psychological problems at the <b>climacteric</b>.</i> |
| <b>coeval</b>        | A person of roughly the same age as oneself; a contemporary.<br><i>These lavas were <b>coeval</b> with the volcanic activity.</i>  |
| <b>dalliance</b>     | A casual romantic or sexual relationship.<br><i>Jack was not averse to an occasional <b>dalliance</b> with a pretty girl.</i>  |
| <b>deferment</b>     | The postponement of a person's conscription.<br><i>He was granted five <b>deferments</b> from the draft.</i>   |
| <b>enduring</b>      | Patently bearing continual wrongs or trouble.<br><i>An <b>enduring</b> disposition.</i>  |
| <b>ensuing</b>       | Occurring afterwards or as a result.<br><i>There were repeated clashes in the <b>ensuing</b> days.</i>   |
| <b>eon</b>           | (Gnosticism) a divine power or nature emanating from the Supreme Being and playing various roles in the operation of the universe.<br><i>Oh that happened <b>eons</b> ago.</i>         |

| <b>epoch</b>         | A particular period of time in history or a person's life.<br><i>These events marked an <b>epoch</b> in their history.</i>  |
| <b>era</b>           | Baseball a measure of a pitcher's effectiveness calculated as the average number of earned runs allowed by the pitcher for every nine innings pitched.<br><i>The Mesozoic <b>era</b>.</i> |
| <b>hour</b>          | A time specified on the twenty four hour clock.<br><i>We live an <b>hour</b> from the airport.</i>  |
| <b>interregnum</b>   | An interval or pause between two periods of office or other things.<br><i>The <b>interregnum</b> between the discovery of radioactivity and its detailed understanding.</i>               |
| <b>meantime</b>      | Meanwhile.<br><i>In the <b>meantime</b> the police were notified.</i>   |
| <b>meanwhile</b>     | During the intervening time.<br><i><b>Meanwhile</b> I will not think about the problem.</i>   |
| <b>mesozoic</b>      | From 230 million to 63 million years ago.   |
| <b>millennial</b>    | A person reaching young adulthood in the early 21st century.<br><i>Generation Xers and <b>millennials</b> have some real gripes about the world their parents constructed.</i>            |
| <b>neolithic</b>     | Of or relating to the most recent period of the Stone Age (following the mesolithic).   |
| <b>neonatal</b>      | Relating to or affecting the infant during the first month after birth.<br><i>Special attention is given to mortality in the <b>neonatal</b> period.</i>                                  |
| <b>paleolithic</b>   | Second part of the Stone Age beginning about 750,000 to 500,000 years BC and lasting until the end of the last ice age about 8,500 years BC.<br><i><b>Paleolithic</b> artifacts.</i>      |
| <b>phase</b>         | A structure containing two verbs in a phase.<br><i>The invertebrate residents of the tundra pass the winter in dormant <b>phase</b>.</i>  |
| <b>proterozoic</b>   | From 2,500 to 544 million years ago; bacteria and fungi; primitive multicellular organisms.<br><i><b>Proterozoic</b> life forms.</i>  |
| <b>retrospective</b> | An exhibition of a representative selection of an artist's life work.<br><i><b>Retrospective</b> self justification.</i>  |
| <b>span</b>          | The wingspan of an aircraft or a bird.<br><i>The parking lot <b>spans</b> 3 acres.</i>  |
| <b>spirit</b>        | Infuse with spirit.<br><i>Shrines to nature <b>spirits</b>.</i>   |
