- *The highest point reached by a given celestial object.*
- *The time at which something is most powerful or successful.*


Dental appliance consisting of an artificial crown for a broken or decayed tooth.

culmination	(astronomy) a heavenly body's highest celestial point above an observer's horizon. <i>The deal marked the culmination of years of negotiation.</i>
flower	A flower together with its stalk picked for use as a decoration. <i>A bunch of flowers.</i>
<u>height</u>	Elevation above ground or a recognized level (typically sea level). <i>He was of medium height.</i>
high point	A lofty level or position or degree.
highest point	A state of altered consciousness induced by alcohol or narcotics.
<u>maximum</u>	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>Production levels are near their maximum.</i>
meridian	A town in eastern Mississippi. <i>The slow movements and postures of t ai chi open up and align the meridians of the body.</i>
<u>optimum</u>	Most favorable conditions or greatest degree or amount possible under given circumstances. <i>The plant grows within a range of 68 and 78 F the optimum being 74.</i>
<u>peak</u>	The point of highest activity, quality, or achievement. <i>The peak halyard.</i>
<u>pinnacle</u>	A slender upright spire at the top of a buttress of tower. <i>He had reached the pinnacle of his career.</i>
prime	A prime number. <i>He wasn't elderly but clearly past his prime.</i>
<u>summit</u>	A meeting of heads of governments. <i>She climbed back up the path towards the summit.</i>
tip	A relatively small amount of money given for services rendered (as by a waiter). <i>They clambered to the tip of Monadnock.</i>
top	The top or extreme point of something usually a mountain or hill. <i>Fill the cup almost to the top.</i>
vertex	The highest point (of something).

<u>acme</u>	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>His landscapes were deemed the acme of beauty.</i>
<u>apex</u>	The highest point (of something). <i>He understands when to apex a corner.</i>
apical	Relating to or denoting an apex.
apogee	The point in the orbit of the moon or a satellite at which it is furthest from the earth. <i>A film which was the apogee of German expressionist cinema.</i>
apotheosis	The highest point in the development of something; a culmination or climax. <i>His appearance as Hamlet was the apotheosis of his career.</i>
butte	An isolated hill with steep sides and a flat top (similar to but narrower than a mesa).

climactic	Consisting of or causing a climax. <i>The film s climactic scenes.</i>
crest	(of a wave) form a curling foamy top. <i>His helmet was crested with a fan of spikes.</i>
elevation	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>A dancer of exceptional elevation.</i>
jag	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>She jagged herself in the mouth.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>The first time I put them on one of the stockings laddered.</i>
lid	An eyelid. <i>Eyes hooded beneath heavy lids.</i>
lofty	Haughty and aloof. <i>The elegant square was shaded by lofty palms.</i>
meridian	Relating to or situated at a meridian. <i>The European Broadcasting Area extends from the Atlantic to the meridian 40 E.</i>
minaret	A slender tower, typically part of a mosque, with a balcony from which a muezzin calls Muslims to prayer.
nadir	The lowest or most unsuccessful point in a situation. <i>Asking that question was the nadir of my career.</i>
peak	Referring to the point at which the specified thing is at its highest level of popularity. <i>Traffic speeds are reduced at peak hours.</i>
pinnacle	Surmount with a pinnacle. <i>He had reached the pinnacle of his career.</i>
plateau	Reach a state of little or no change after a period of activity or progress. <i>The industry s problems have plateaued out.</i>
raised	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i>Raised metalwork.</i>
rung	A horizontal support on a ladder for a person's foot. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom rung.</i>
summit	Reach the summit of a mountain or hill. <i>Many mountaineers go up Mt Everest but not all summit.</i>
superlative	The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. <i>So many highest superlatives achieved by man.</i>

top	Be at the top of or constitute the top or highest point. <i>The top shelf.</i>
towering	Of great intensity. <i>Towering icebergs.</i>
turret	A small tower on top of a larger tower or at the corner of a building or wall, typically of a castle. <i>A castle with fairy tale turrets.</i>
unsurpassed	Not capable of being improved on. <i>The quality of workmanship is unsurpassed.</i>
upper	A central nervous system stimulant that increases energy and decreases appetite; used to treat narcolepsy and some forms of depression. <i>His upper arm.</i>
uppermost	Highest in place, rank, or importance. <i>The uppermost windows.</i>
vertex	The point at which an axis meets a curve or surface.
