### Definitions of "Zenith" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “zenith” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The point above the observer that is directly opposite the nadir on the imaginary sphere against which celestial bodies appear to be projected.*
- *The point in the sky or celestial sphere directly above an observer.*
- *The highest point reached by a given celestial object.*
- *The time at which something is most powerful or successful.*

- acme** The highest point (of something).  
*Physics is the **acme** of scientific knowledge.*
- apex** The highest point (of something).  
*The **apex** of the roof.*
- apogee** The point in the orbit of the moon or a satellite at which it is furthest from the earth.  
*A film which was the **apogee** of German expressionist cinema.*
- crest** The center of a cambered road.  
*Take hold of the mane halfway up the horse's **crest**.*
- crown** Dentistry dental appliance consisting of an artificial crown for a broken or decayed tooth.  
*His hair was swept straight back over his **crown**.*
- crowning point** Dental appliance consisting of an artificial crown for a broken or decayed tooth.

<b>culmination</b>	(astronomy) a heavenly body's highest celestial point above an observer's horizon. <i>The deal marked the <b>culmination</b> of years of negotiation.</i>
<b>flower</b>	A flower together with its stalk picked for use as a decoration. <i>A bunch of <b>flowers</b>.</i>
<u><b>height</b></u>	Elevation above ground or a recognized level (typically sea level). <i>He was of medium <b>height</b>.</i>
<b>high point</b>	A lofty level or position or degree.
<b>highest point</b>	A state of altered consciousness induced by alcohol or narcotics.
<u><b>maximum</b></u>	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>Production levels are near their <b>maximum</b>.</i>
<b>meridian</b>	A town in eastern Mississippi. <i>The slow movements and postures of t ai chi open up and align the <b>meridians</b> of the body.</i>
<u><b>optimum</b></u>	Most favorable conditions or greatest degree or amount possible under given circumstances. <i>The plant grows within a range of 68 and 78 F the <b>optimum</b> being 74.</i>
<u><b>peak</b></u>	The point of highest activity, quality, or achievement. <i>The <b>peak</b> halyard.</i>
<u><b>pinnacle</b></u>	A slender upright spire at the top of a buttress of tower. <i>He had reached the <b>pinnacle</b> of his career.</i>
<b>prime</b>	A prime number. <i>He wasn't elderly but clearly past his <b>prime</b>.</i>
<u><b>summit</b></u>	A meeting of heads of governments. <i>She climbed back up the path towards the <b>summit</b>.</i>
<b>tip</b>	A relatively small amount of money given for services rendered (as by a waiter). <i>They clambered to the <b>tip</b> of Monadnock.</i>
<b>top</b>	The top or extreme point of something usually a mountain or hill. <i>Fill the cup almost to the <b>top</b>.</i>
<b>vertex</b>	The highest point (of something).

## Associations of "Zenith" (30 Words)

- acme** The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development.  
*His landscapes were deemed the **acme** of beauty.*
- apex** The highest point (of something).  
*He understands when to **apex** a corner.*
- apical** Relating to or denoting an apex.
- apogee** The point in the orbit of the moon or a satellite at which it is furthest from the earth.  
*A film which was the **apogee** of German expressionist cinema.*
- apotheosis** The highest point in the development of something; a culmination or climax.  
*His appearance as Hamlet was the **apotheosis** of his career.*
- butte** An isolated hill with steep sides and a flat top (similar to but narrower than a mesa).

<b>climactic</b>	Consisting of or causing a climax. <i>The film s <b>climactic</b> scenes.</i>
<b>crest</b>	(of a wave) form a curling foamy top. <i>His helmet was <b>crested</b> with a fan of spikes.</i>
<b>elevation</b>	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>A dancer of exceptional <b>elevation</b>.</i>
<b>jag</b>	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>She <b>jagged</b> herself in the mouth.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>The first time I put them on one of the stockings <b>laddered</b>.</i>
<b>lid</b>	An eyelid. <i>Eyes hooded beneath heavy <b>lids</b>.</i>
<b>lofty</b>	Haughty and aloof. <i>The elegant square was shaded by <b>lofty</b> palms.</i>
<b>meridian</b>	Relating to or situated at a meridian. <i>The European Broadcasting Area extends from the Atlantic to the <b>meridian</b> 40 E.</i>
<b>minaret</b>	A slender tower, typically part of a mosque, with a balcony from which a muezzin calls Muslims to prayer.
<b>nadir</b>	The lowest or most unsuccessful point in a situation. <i>Asking that question was the <b>nadir</b> of my career.</i>
<b>peak</b>	Referring to the point at which the specified thing is at its highest level of popularity. <i>Traffic speeds are reduced at <b>peak</b> hours.</i>
<b>pinnacle</b>	Surmount with a pinnacle. <i>He had reached the <b>pinnacle</b> of his career.</i>
<b>plateau</b>	Reach a state of little or no change after a period of activity or progress. <i>The industry s problems have <b>plateaued</b> out.</i>
<b>raised</b>	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i><b>Raised</b> metalwork.</i>
<b>rung</b>	A horizontal support on a ladder for a person's foot. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom <b>rung</b>.</i>
<b>summit</b>	Reach the summit of a mountain or hill. <i>Many mountaineers go up Mt Everest but not all <b>summit</b>.</i>
<b>superlative</b>	The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. <i>So many highest <b>superlatives</b> achieved by man.</i>



- top** Be at the top of or constitute the top or highest point.  
*The **top** shelf.*
- towering** Of great intensity.  
***Towering** icebergs.*
- turret** A small tower on top of a larger tower or at the corner of a building or wall, typically of a castle.  
*A castle with fairy tale **turrets**.*
- unsurpassed** Not capable of being improved on.  
*The quality of workmanship is **unsurpassed**.*
- upper** A central nervous system stimulant that increases energy and decreases appetite; used to treat narcolepsy and some forms of depression.  
*His **upper** arm.*
- uppermost** Highest in place, rank, or importance.  
*The **uppermost** windows.*
- vertex** The point at which an axis meets a curve or surface.
